RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Proud residents of the Texas Panhandle are gathering in Austin on February 17, 2015, to celebrate Panhandle Day at the 2 State Capitol, and this occasion offers a welcome opportunity to 3 honor their region's rich heritage and many noteworthy features; 4 5 and 6 WHEREAS, One of the oldest inhabited areas of Texas, the 7 Panhandle is crossed by the Canadian and Red Rivers, rests over the southern tip of the Ogallala Aquifer, and offers breathtaking views 8 9 of Palo Duro Canyon, the second-largest canyon in the country; its 10 vast rolling plains were once roamed by Paleo-Indian hunters, long before Francisco Vazquez de Coronado became the first European to 11 12 reach the area in 1541; it remained contested territory throughout much of its history, until the Compromise of 1850, when it assumed 13 14 its modern boundaries; and WHEREAS, Ranching became central to the Panhandle's culture 15 16 and economy in the late 19th century; during this time, two of the area's major ranches were established: JA Ranch, which began in 17 1876 when Charles Goodnight arrived with a herd of longhorn cattle 18 from Colorado, and XIT Ranch, which was formed in the 1880s from 19 20 three million acres of Panhandle land traded by the state to finance 21 construction of a new Texas Capitol; the regional economy was further diversified with the advent of the railroads and dryland 22 23 farming techniques, which led to a greater role for wheat and cotton

farming, and the discovery of oil and natural gas in the 1920s;

- 1 today, the agriculture, oil and gas, and wind industries continue
- 2 to be important to the region, and there are two large refining
- 3 facilities, the Valero McKee Refinery in Sunray and the
- 4 ConocoPhillips Refinery in Borger; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Amarillo, in Potter and Randall Counties, is an
- 6 essential component of the prosperity of the Panhandle, with Tyson
- 7 Foods, Bell Helicopter, Pantex, and multiple state-of-the-art
- 8 health care systems all serving as major employers; in addition,
- 9 the city is home to two major associations, the American Quarter
- 10 Horse Association and the Texas Cattle Feeders Association; the
- 11 nearby town of Canyon offers access to Palo Duro Canyon State Park,
- 12 designated as one of "America's 10 Best State Parks" by Fodor's
- 13 Travel, and is home to the long-running outdoor musical drama
- 14 Texas, which chronicles the story of Panhandle settlers in the
- 15 1800s; other notable communities include Pampa, the second-largest
- 16 city in the Panhandle and a commercial center for oil and livestock,
- 17 Dalhart, which hosts the annual XIT Rodeo and Reunion, and Dumas and
- 18 Hereford, major centers for cattle feeding operations and beef
- 19 processing plants; this area, known as Cattle-Feeding Country,
- 20 supports a multibillion dollar industry with the largest
- 21 proliferation of feedlots in the nation; and
- WHEREAS, The Panhandle is home to such premier educational
- 23 institutions as the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center,
- 24 with its schools of medicine, pharmacy, and allied health sciences,
- 25 and West Texas A&M University, both of which boast nationally
- 26 recognized programs and faculty; Amarillo College continues to be
- 27 among the finest community colleges in the country, and Wayland

- 1 Baptist University, Frank Phillips College, and Clarendon College
- 2 also offer outstanding educational opportunities; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Visitors and residents alike enjoy a range of
- 4 attractions, including a number of museums, such as the American
- 5 Quarter Horse Museum and the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum,
- 6 with over 2 million artifacts, along with such cultural assets as
- 7 the Amarillo Museum of Art, the Lone Star Ballet, and the Amarillo
- 8 Symphony; moreover, the adventurous can drive the length of the
- 9 legendary Route 66 through Texas, starting in Glen Rio and passing
- 10 through Amarillo's popular historic district before ending their
- 11 journey in Shamrock; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Known for their hospitality, strong work ethic, and
- 13 resilience, or, as Stratford's welcome sign proclaims, "God, Grass,
- 14 and Grit," the citizens of the Texas Panhandle may take great pride
- 15 in all they have done to make their region one of the treasures of
- 16 the Lone Star State; now, therefore, be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 84th Texas
- 18 Legislature hereby recognize February 17, 2015, as Panhandle Day at
- 19 the State Capitol and extend to the visiting guests sincere best
- 20 wishes for a meaningful and memorable stay in Austin.
