1           WHEREAS, Dinah Weable of Waxahachie greatly benefited her  
2 fellow citizens through her 22 years of exemplary service as  
3 constituent director of Texas House District 10; and

4           WHEREAS, Throughout her tenure, Ms. Weable worked tirelessly  
5 to assist residents with their concerns, and her skill and  
6 dedication were rivaled only by her remarkable knowledge of the  
7 community; she provided invaluable support to State Representative  
8 Jim Pitts in his work in behalf of the people of Texas, and he has  
9 gratefully acknowledged that she played a vital part in his every  
10 accomplishment as a member of the Texas Legislature; and

11           WHEREAS, Ms. Weable has also made a positive difference in  
12 many lives as a health advocate; diagnosed with breast cancer in  
13 2002, she inspired others with her grace and courage while  
14 successfully battling the disease, and she subsequently became  
15 involved in efforts to raise awareness and promote wellness; her  
16 husband, Ray Weable, organized a survivors celebration in her honor  
17 in 2004, and they subsequently created a nonprofit organization,  
18 the Dinah Weable Breast Cancer Survivors Event, which raises funds  
19 for mammograms for those in need; every year, she hosts the Pink  
20 Ribbons and Heart Luncheon, and the proceeds have paid for some 700  
21 cancer screenings; and

22           WHEREAS, Born in Camden, Arkansas, Ms. Weable graduated from  
23 Camden High School, where she and her future husband were  
24 sweethearts; she went on to attend Louisiana Tech University, and

1 she married in 1960; after moving to Waxahachie in 1985, she worked  
2 for the Waxahachie Chamber of Commerce for six years; she is an  
3 active member of First United Methodist Church; and

4 WHEREAS, Dinah Weable set the highest standards of excellence  
5 as a public servant for more than two decades, and her contributions  
6 to her community and to the Lone Star State have earned the deep  
7 respect and admiration of all who have the privilege of knowing her;  
8 now, therefore, be it

9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 84th Texas  
10 Legislature hereby congratulate Dinah Weable on her retirement as  
11 constituent director of Texas House District 10 and extend to her  
12 sincere best wishes for the future; and, be it further

13 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be  
14 prepared for Ms. Weable as an expression of high regard by the Texas  
15 House of Representatives.
