- 1 WHEREAS, Representatives of liquefied natural gas projects,
- 2 exploration and production companies, state business trade groups,
- 3 pipeline companies, government, and other stakeholders are
- 4 gathering in Austin on February 25, 2015, to highlight the benefits
- 5 of liquefied natural gas (LNG) exports; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Pioneering exploration and extraction methods have
- 7 opened vast natural gas resources to development, and demand on
- 8 U.S. natural gas markets can now grow with little impact on domestic
- 9 prices; plentiful supplies and unprecedented advances in
- 10 technology also present a historic opportunity for the United
- 11 States to achieve energy self-sufficiency while creating jobs and
- 12 wealth; and
- WHEREAS, Global demand for LNG is expected to climb
- 14 significantly over the next two decades; the U.S. Department of
- 15 Energy estimates that, by 2035, natural gas production levels will
- 16 be 55 percent higher than was estimated only four years ago; this
- 17 trend can satisfy all domestic demand while also allowing the
- 18 nation to export natural gas; and
- 19 WHEREAS, According to recent studies, the expansion of LNG
- 20 markets will generate as much as \$86 billion in net benefits to the
- 21 U.S. economy and will help reduce the U.S. trade deficit by as much
- 22 as \$60 billion by 2038; moreover, increases in LNG exports could
- 23 create more than 450,000 American jobs, including tens of thousands
- 24 of jobs in construction and operations; every two billion cubic

- 1 feet per day of exports supports 50,000 jobs in the exploration and
- 2 production sectors; and
- 3 WHEREAS, In Texas, proposed construction and operation of
- 4 multiple LNG export facilities along the Gulf Coast will
- 5 incentivize new direct infrastructure investments worth billions
- 6 of dollars, will contribute royalties and local tax revenues to
- 7 communities across the state, and could create up to 155,000 jobs in
- 8 the state; and
- 9 WHEREAS, LNG exports will contribute to the nation's global
- 10 energy leadership and to other vital goals, among them stability in
- 11 natural gas pricing, increased business investment, job growth, and
- 12 higher revenues for communities in natural-gas-producing areas;
- 13 now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 84th Texas
- 15 Legislature hereby recognize February 25, 2015, as Liquefied
- 16 Natural Gas (LNG) Day at the State Capitol and extend to all those
- 17 participating in this event sincere best wishes for an enjoyable
- 18 and educational visit to Austin.
