## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Proud members of the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity are 2 gathering at the State Capitol on March 2, 2015, and this is a 3 fitting opportunity to celebrate the fraternity's exceptional 4 legacy of civic engagement; and

5 WHEREAS, Established at Cornell University on December 4, 1906, Alpha Phi Alpha was the first intercollegiate Greek-letter 6 7 fraternity established by African Americans; founded by seven men who came to be known as the "Jewels" of the organization, Alpha Phi 8 9 Alpha initially served as a study and support group for minority students who were struggling against racial prejudice; these early 10 11 leaders laid the foundation for the fraternity's principles of 12 scholarship, fellowship, character, and the uplifting of humanity; 13 and

14 WHEREAS, In the years that followed, Alpha Phi Alpha chapters were formed at other colleges across the nation; while the 15 16 fraternity placed a strong emphasis on the academic excellence of its members, it also expanded its focus to address the educational, 17 economic, political, and social injustices faced by African 18 Americans and people of color around the world; over the decades, 19 20 many former Alpha Phi Alpha members have stood at the forefront of 21 the fight for civil rights, including W. E. B. Du Bois, Paul Robeson, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., Thurgood Marshall, Adam 22 23 Clayton Powell Jr., Edward Brooke, Andrew Young, and William Gray; 24 and

1 WHEREAS, Alpha Phi Alpha has been an internacial group since 2 1945 and now encompasses chapters in five U.S. regions; the 3 fraternity has an especially rich history in the Lone Star State, 4 which has been home to three of the organization's general 5 presidents; in addition, a number of prominent Texas leaders are 6 Alpha Phi Alpha alumni, including several members of the Texas 7 House of Representatives; and

8 WHEREAS, Throughout its history, Alpha Phi Alpha has worked 9 to foster a brotherhood of concerned citizens who devote themselves 10 to the greater good, and its members may indeed reflect with pride 11 on their organization's noteworthy tradition of activism and 12 achievement; now, therefore, be it

13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 84th Texas 14 Legislature hereby recognize March 2, 2015, as Alpha Phi Alpha 15 Fraternity Day at the State Capitol and extend to the visiting 16 members sincere best wishes for continued success; and, be it 17 further

18 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be 19 prepared for the fraternity as an expression of high regard by the 20 Texas House of Representatives.
