RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, A rich and purposeful life drew to a close with the 2 passing of Ruffner Perry Baugh of Rockport on February 2, 2015, at 3 the age of 91; and

WHEREAS, Ruffner Baugh was born on November 21, 1923, in
Asheville, North Carolina, to George Herman Baugh Sr. and Lena
Mabel Whitfield; raised in Charlotte, he went on to pursue his
higher education at Duke University; and

WHEREAS, Answering his nation's call to duty during World War 8 9 II, Mr. Baugh interrupted his studies at Duke in November 1942 to enlist in the Army Air Corps and train as a bomber pilot; he flew 10 11 combat missions over Europe during the Ardennes counteroffensive, 12 and he earned two Bronze Stars and the ETO Ribbon; following the war, he served in the Air Force Officers' Reserve Corps until 1955, 13 14 and he would occasionally fly over his home and wiggle the wings of his plane to say hello to his loved ones below; and 15

16 WHEREAS, After returning to civilian life, Mr. Baugh joined 17 Chance Vought Aircraft in Connecticut, and he transferred to the 18 company's Dallas office in 1949; he continued to work for the 19 enterprise, which later became LTV Corporation, for 38 years, 20 reaching the position of head of production planning; and

21 WHEREAS, In retirement, Mr. Baugh and his second wife, 22 Patricia, whom he married in 1975, sold their home in Dallas, bought 23 a trailer, and set off on a five-year road trip that took them all 24 across the nation, from coast to coast and from Florida to Alaska;

1 they eventually settled in Rockport; and

WHEREAS, "Ruff" Baugh loved gardening and the Dallas Cowboys, and he delighted in the accomplishments of his grandchildren; a lively and energetic man, he could roller-skate and ride a bicycle backwards into his 60s, and in his 80s, he was still a fierce competitor on the tennis court; and

7 WHEREAS, A loving husband, a devoted father and grandfather, 8 and a proud veteran of World War II, Ruff Baugh lived life to the 9 fullest, and memories of his time on this earth will continue to 10 inspire all those who knew and loved him; now, therefore, be it
