14 WHEREAS, Mrs. Patterson later worked as a political consultant, and she was a driving force in a multitude of Republican 15 16 organizations; a longtime member of the Texas Federation of Republican Women, she held numerous leadership positions within the 17 organization, and during her term as president, she came up with the 18 idea of wearing red jackets when members visited the State Capitol 19 20 for their legislative day; other groups that benefited from her 21 involvement were the Lake Highlands and the Town East Republican 22 Women's Clubs and the Dallas County Council of Republican Women, 23 and she served as a regional chair and delegate to the Dallas County

No. 809 1 WHEREAS, Jan Patterson's public-spiritedness also led her to volunteer her time with the City of Dallas Plan Commission, the City 2 of Dallas Health and Human Services Commission, and the Lake Highlands Women's League; her leadership was acknowledged at the 4 5 state level with back-to-back appointments by Governors Bill Clements and George W. Bush to the Texas Board on Aging, which she 6 also served as chair; additionally, she accepted gubernatorial 7 8 appointments to serve as a Texas delegate to the White House Conference on Families in 1980 and the White House Conference on 9 10 Aging in 1995; and WHEREAS, Even as she battled illness near the end of her life, 11 Mrs. Patterson never lost her passion for helping others; she belonged to the Order of the Daughters of the King at St. John's Episcopal Church, through which she comforted and ministered to

12 13 14 15 other congregants and neighbors in Lake Highlands; known for her warm heart, abiding faith, and ever-present smile, she freely 16 17 expressed affection for her family and friends that was returned fully in kind, and she particularly cherished her role as "nanny" to 18 her precious grandchildren; and 19
