1 WHEREAS, Since 2007, the Rise School of Corpus Christi has 2 provided a unique and supportive learning environment for area 3 toddlers and preschoolers, including those with special needs; and

WHEREAS, The school was established by a Corpus Christi couple who, after their son was born with Down syndrome in 2006, began a search for an early childhood program that could offer full-time educational and therapeutic services for young children with developmental disabilities; and

9 WHEREAS, Discouraged by the lack of opportunities in the area, the family discovered the "Rise" program in Tuscaloosa, 10 11 Alabama, which uses a research-based model in which children with 12 disabilities are integrated with nondisabled peers; this tested approach, combined with other best practices in early childhood 13 14 education, has resulted in a higher level of achievement among children in the program compared with more traditional learning 15 16 methods; and

WHEREAS, In order to make this state-of-the-art resource a 17 reality in Corpus Christi, a skilled and motivated staff of 18 community volunteers was recruited, and a partnership was forged 19 with Driscoll Children's Hospital; the Rise School of Corpus 20 21 Christi today builds on this strong foundation in its mission to ensure its young charges every advantage in reaching their full 22 23 potential, and the school is also engaged in research, outreach, and public awareness activities; and 24
