RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Troy Vincent was born June 8, 1970, in Trenton, New
- 2 Jersey; he grew up in East Trenton then moved to suburban Bucks
- 3 County, Pennsylvania, where he attended Pennsbury High School and
- 4 starred in football and track; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Troy's talent on the football field brought him
- 6 several scholarship offers; he chose the University of Wisconsin,
- 7 where he started on varsity his freshman year as a defensive back
- 8 and return man; and
- 9 WHEREAS, An impact player, Troy earned a letter all four
- 10 years at Wisconsin; as a sophomore in 1989, he led the Big Ten with a
- 11 15.1 punt return average; as a junior he set new Wisconsin
- 12 single-season and career records for passes broken up; in 1991,
- 13 Troy was voted team captain and MVP; that season he was also named
- 14 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, set a school record for punt
- 15 return yards, and was honored as an All-American as a senior--the
- 16 school's first since 1987; and
- WHEREAS, In 1992 he entered the NFL Draft and was the seventh
- 18 pick in the first round by the Miami Dolphins; wearing #23, he
- 19 started at left corner as a rookie and helped the Dolphins reach the
- 20 AFC Championship Game; Miami had a winning record in each of Troy's
- 21 four seasons with the team and made the playoffs three times; during
- 22 that time, Troy intercepted 14 passes and ranked among the team
- 23 leaders in tackles; and
- 24 WHEREAS, In 1996, Troy signed with the Philadelphia Eagles as

- 1 a free agent; Vincent was a major player in the Eagles' dominant
- 2 defense of the late '90s; he was selected for the Pro Bowl
- 3 consecutively from 1999 to 2003, and was named First-Team All-Pro
- 4 in 2002; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In 1999, Troy tied for the NFL lead in interceptions
- 6 with a total of 7, and in 2001 helped the Eagles get to the NFC
- 7 Championship Game; and
- 8 WHEREAS, In 2004, Vincent agreed to terms with the Buffalo
- 9 Bills, ending a stellar eight-year tenure with Philadelphia; then
- 10 in 2006 he moved to the Washington Redskins; he retired from the NFL
- 11 following that season and finished with a total of 47 career
- 12 interceptions; and
- WHEREAS, Troy's leadership and success extends well beyond
- 14 the football field to this day; he has served as VP of the NFL Player
- 15 Engagement Organization, Board of Directors for the University of
- 16 Wisconsin Foundation, and the State of New Jersey After 3 Program;
- 17 he has spoken at league-held seminars on the importance of sound
- 18 financial planning and preparing for life after football; he served
- 19 as president of the NFL Players Association and became the first
- 20 active NFL player to serve on the National Board of Directors for
- 21 Pop Warner Little Scholars Football; and
- 22 WHEREAS, In 2010, Vincent also partnered with Feed The
- 23 Children to help families in need and returned to Pennsbury School
- 24 District in support of the Fuel Up To Play 60 program; recently,
- 25 Troy was honored with a 2012 Jefferson Award for outstanding public
- 26 service by an athlete and was elected to the Philadelphia Eagles
- 27 Hall of Fame; now, therefore, be it
