WHEREAS, Baylor University was established February 1, 1845, by an act of the Congress of the Republic of Texas; it is the oldest continually operating university in the state; and

7 WHEREAS, This private Christian university and nationally 8 ranked research institution provides a vibrant campus community to 9 more than 15,000 students; it offers 141 undergraduate degrees, 75 10 graduate degrees, 37 doctoral degrees, and a juris doctor in 11 addition to a wide array of preprofessional tracks and specialized 12 academic opportunities; and

WHEREAS, Baylor University is also home to a variety of exceptional athletic programs; its football team recently won the school's first outright conference championship since 1980, and the women's basketball team continued its dominance with its fourth consecutive sweep of regular-season and conference tournament titles; and

WHEREAS, The university produced the top graduate success rate score in the Big 12 Conference in the 2013-2014 academic year; a school-record 213 Baylor University student-athletes were selected to Academic All-Big 12 teams, and a school-record 678 students were named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll; and WHEREAS, The school's interdisciplinary research and a
