RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The city of Abilene lost a beloved resident with the 2 untimely passing of Brian Joseph Green on March 12, 2015, at the age 3 of 56; and

WHEREAS, Born in Dayton, Ohio, on July 21, 1958, to Robert and Gail Green, Brian Green grew up in Columbus and graduated from Upper Arlington High School; he studied aeronautics at Ohio State University and remained an ardent fan of the Buckeyes throughout his life; after college, he went on to serve his country as a member of the Air National Guard for nine years; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Green first went to Abilene as an air force 10 contractor at Dyess Air Force Base and settled there permanently in 11 12 1987; following his retirement from the military, he teamed up with the Abilene Preservation League to renovate the Compton Building, 13 14 which he converted into an upscale restaurant; the opening of Cypress Street Station in 1993 was an important step in the 15 revitalization of downtown Abilene, and the business was such a 16 success that Mr. Green later added Abilene Brewing Company, the 17 first brewery in the area; and 18

WHEREAS, Devoted to his adopted hometown, Mr. Green gave generously of his time and talents to a number of worthwhile organizations, including the Abilene Youth Sports Authority, the Abilene Chamber of Commerce, the Hendrick Medical Center Foundation, and the Paramount Theatre; in addition, he brought the Texas HOG motorcycle rally to Abilene as president of the Abilene

1 Convention and Visitors Bureau, and he worked with the city's 2 cultural affairs council to organize the Broadway in Abilene 3 series; a member of the Texas Restaurant Association and its 4 Abilene chapter, he was also instrumental in the establishment of a 5 culinary school in the city; and

6 WHEREAS, Caring and compassionate, Mr. Green took a personal 7 interest in his employees and others in the community, and he was 8 always ready to lend a hand to those in need; above all else, he 9 cherished the time he spent with his beloved daughter, Ryleigh; and

10 WHEREAS, Though it is impossible to gauge the full effect of 11 one man's life, some people leave their unmistakable mark on the 12 world as they move through it, and Brian Green was indeed one such 13 individual; now, therefore, be it
