R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, Members of the Live Oak County Historical Commission  
2 are gathering at the State Capitol to celebrate Live Oak County  
3 Historical Commission Day on April 8, 2015; and

4           WHEREAS, The Live Oak County Historical Commission was  
5 founded in the early 1960s under the auspices of Judge Harry L.  
6 Hinton to help preserve and promote local history; and

7           WHEREAS, The commission strives to educate the public through  
8 the publication of historical resources and through collaboration  
9 with local civic organizations; staff and volunteers also work with  
10 local officials to strengthen policy related to preservation and to  
11 honor outstanding individuals and businesses that have helped shape

14 history by placing historical markers at notable sites throughout  
15 the area; it also advocates for the acquisition of archeological  
16 grants to study historic sites, such as the Fort Merrill grounds;
