## R E S OLUTION

WHEREAS, With a unique history spanning more than 150 years, Los Portales is one of El Paso County's cultural treasures; and

WHEREAS, Constructed in the 1850s by Gregorio N. Garcia, Los Portales, sometimes known as Casa Garcia, was originally used as a residence; "Don Gregorio" played a prominent role in the community, serving as a captain of the Texas Rangers and as county judge for El Paso County; his son, who bore the same name, became a justice of the peace; and

WHEREAS, The one-story adobe brick structure has a flat roof supported by cottonwood rafters; named for its distinctive inset gallery, or "portal," the Territorial Style building also features milled wood supports and pedimented lintels on the frames of windows and doors; and

WHEREAS, In 1870, Mr. Garcia donated Los Portales to the town for use as a school; its first teacher, Octaviano Ambrosio Larrazolo, went on to serve as governor of New Mexico and as a United States senator; in the late 1930s, the building was converted into apartments, and it later served as offices for the San Elizario Independent School District; a Recorded Texas Historic Landmark, Los Portales is now owned by the county and operated by the San Elizario Genealogy and Historical Society as a museum and information center; and

WHEREAS, The residents of the State of Texas are heirs to an extraordinarily rich heritage, and Los Portales serves as an
RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 84 th Texas
Legislature hereby honor Los Portales and extend to all those
associated with the museum sincere best wishes for the future; and,
