1 WHEREAS, Diana R. Garland has deservedly been recognized by
2 the board of trustees of Baylor University with the renaming of the
3 institution's School of Social Work in her honor; and

4 WHEREAS, Ms. Garland joined the Baylor College of Arts and
5 Sciences faculty as a professor of social work in 1997; in 1999, the
6 program became a separate department, and she served as chair for
7 four years before being named the inaugural dean of the newly
8 established School of Social Work in 2005; and

9 WHEREAS, In that important position, Ms. Garland has
10 overseen many impressive developments, including the expansion of
11 the full-time faculty from 5 to 20 members, the creation of a Ph.D.
12 program, and the relocation of the school to its own building in
13 downtown Waco; moreover, the school was recognized in the 2012 list
14 of the Best Graduate Schools published by *U.S. News & World Report*,
15 and in the fall of 2015, it is opening a Houston campus, which will
16 offer a master of social work degree; and

17 WHEREAS, Ms. Garland is concluding her notable tenure as dean
18 on June 1, 2015, at which time she will resume her role as a faculty
19 member; and

20 WHEREAS, Through her leadership, vision, and dedication,
21 Ms. Garland has significantly benefited the Baylor School of Social
22 Work, and she has earned the lasting respect and admiration of
23 colleagues, faculty, and students alike; now, therefore, be it
