- 11 marriage spanning many years together until his passing, and he was

- WHEREAS, After graduating from college, Mr. Green moved with
- 16 his family to Dallas, where he became the first African American
- 17 marketing representative for the Southwest District of Mobil Oil;
- 18 he went on to work for Fox and Jacobs Homes and Xerox, and in 1975,
- 19 he returned to Houston, where he worked for Southern Pacific
- 20 Railroad and ran his own company, Green's Iron Work and Burglar
- 21 Bars; he was also employed by the Aldine Independent School
- 22 District and retired from the district as superintendent for school
- 23 expansion and improvements; and
- 24 WHEREAS, A man of strong religious faith, Mr. Green was a
- 25 longtime member of Sloan Memorial United Methodist Church, where he

- 1 served as a trustee and a member of the United Methodist Men; in
- 2 addition, he ministered to men with cancer at the Life (Cancer)
- 3 Ministry of Windsor Village United Methodist Church; and

- 5 for his church with his popular barbecue and fish fry dinners, and
- 6 he was an enthusiastic and expert gardener who delighted in sharing
