

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board is
2 celebrating the 75th anniversary of its founding in 2015; and

3 WHEREAS, The Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board
4 was established by the Texas Legislature in 1939 in order to address
5 the agricultural practices and problems of wind and water erosion
6 that led to the Dust Bowl devastation of Texas and the Great Plains
7 in the 1930s; and

8 WHEREAS, This landmark legislation called for the creation of
9 soil and water conservation districts; the initiative was designed
10 to be controlled by farmers and ranchers on a voluntary basis and to
11 implement measures that best suited the specific needs of
12 individual landowners; and

13 WHEREAS, Today, the board administers a number of key
14 programs that provide technical and financial assistance to
15 landowners and land managers; among the results of these efforts
16 are enhanced soil resources, more sustainable agriculture,
17 improved water quality, and higher-quality wildlife habitat; and

18 WHEREAS, The Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board
19 has had a profound impact on the preservation and protection of our
20 state's natural resources, and it is truly deserving of special
21 recognition for its exceptional work; now, therefore, be it

22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 84th Texas
23 Legislature hereby commemorate the 75th anniversary of the founding
24 of the Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board and extend to

2 their important work; and, be it further

3 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
