RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, The picturesque Hill Country community of Llano has
- 2 long been known across the state and nation as a premier location
- 3 for deer hunting; and
- WHEREAS, In the years after its founding in 1855, Llano was
- 5 the last stop on the railroad and an outpost on the edge of the
- 6 largely unsettled land that extended to the west; many settlers
- 7 relied on the abundant deer and other game as a source of food,
- 8 particularly as they were first establishing their ranches and
- 9 farms; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Even after the frontier era passed, the countryside
- 11 near Llano retained its thriving deer population; hunters from
- 12 other parts of the state and beyond began making trips to the area,
- 13 and by the early decades of the 1900s, the community was being
- 14 nicknamed and thereby regarded by many as the "Deer Capital of
- 15 Texas"; and
- WHEREAS, Today, the town remains one of the Lone Star State's
- 17 most popular destinations for deer hunters; the region of the Hill
- 18 Country around Llano boasts a ratio of one deer for every two to
- 19 three acres of land, representing a density of deer greater than any
- 20 other area in the United States; and
- 21 WHEREAS, More than 15,000 people hunt in Llano County each
- 22 year, harvesting over 12,000 white-tailed deer annually; the
- 23 hunters spend as much as \$3.5 million in the county, making the
- 24 sport a significant factor in the local economy; and

- 1 WHEREAS, On the Friday before the start of each deer season,
- 2 the Llano Chamber of Commerce hosts a Hunters Welcome event to
- 3 express the city's appreciation for the contributions hunters make
- 4 to the town's prosperity, and throughout the season, banners,
- 5 posters, and special offers from businesses create a friendly
- 6 environment for hunting enthusiasts; and
- WHEREAS, From its origins as a frontier town to the present
- 8 day, Llano has been a paradise for deer hunters, and the economic
- 9 impact of deer hunting has been and continues to be an important
- 10 driver of Llano's economy; now, therefore, be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 84th Texas
- 12 Legislature hereby honor Llano for its rich history as a renowned
- 13 destination for Texas deer hunters; and, be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
- 15 prepared for the city of Llano as an expression of high regard by
- 16 the Texas House of Representatives.
