R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The citizens of Brazos County lost an admired
2 community leader with the passing of former county judge Arthur
3 Randolph Sims on April 2, 2015, at the age of 75; and

4 WHEREAS, Randy Sims was born in Houston on July 31, 1939, to
5 William Arthur and Augusta Randolph Sims; he attended Stephen F.
6 Austin High School, and went on to further his education at Texas
7 A&M University on a football scholarship; he was an exceptional
8 running back and place kicker, and for a number of years he held the
9 Southwest Conference record for a field goal kick of 52 yards; and

10 WHEREAS, Judge Sims remained in Bryan-College Station after
11 he graduated and operated a popular barbecue restaurant for 27
12 years; dedicated to working for the well-being of his fellow
13 residents, he served as Brazos County Commissioner for 16 years,
14 and he was also on the Bryan City Council; in 2003, he was elected
15 Brazos County Judge, a position he held until 2010; and

16 WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, Judge Sims had the love and
17 support of his wife of 54 years, Brenda, and he was the proud father
18 of Randy and Diana; and

19 WHEREAS, A widely respected businessman and county official,
20 Judge Randy Sims will be deeply missed, but his achievements and
21 high standards for public service will continue to benefit the area
22 for years to come; now, therefore, be it

24 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of the Honorable

1 Arthur Randolph Sims and extend sincere sympathy to the members of
