1 WHEREAS, A full and generous life drew to a close with the 2 death of Mary Virginia Parr of Robstown on May 12, 2015, at the age 3 of 96; and

WHEREAS, The former Mary Virginia Sloane was born in Estill,
Mississippi, on July 22, 1918, to Albert Sloane and Virginia
Adeline Meadow; when she was 10, her father died, and the family
moved to Texas and settled in West Sinton in San Patricio County;
after graduating from Sinton High School in 1934, she attended Mary
Hardin-Baylor College for two years, earning a teaching certificate
at age 18; and

9 10 WHEREAS, Ms. Sloane returned to her alma mater in West Sinton 11 12 to teach English and Spanish and coach girls' basketball and tennis; during the summers, she continued her education at the 13 14 University of Mississippi and the Texas College of Arts and Industries, earning a master's degree in English and Spanish; and 15 WHEREAS, In 1940, she exchanged vows with W. Robert Parr of 16 Robstown, beginning a marriage that ultimately spanned 70 years 17 before Mr. Parr passed away in 2011; the couple became the parents 18 of three children, Robert, Earl, and Sylvia, and with the passing 19 20 decades, the family grew to include two additional generations; and 21 WHEREAS, During World War II, Mrs. Parr worked as a teacher 22 and managed her husband's farm until he returned from his military 23 service in 1945; after the war, the couple founded the Parr Block

Company in Corpus Christi and operated it for four decades, and

- 4 and helping to found the Robstown Garden Club; she took delight in

- WHEREAS, Mary Parr was an energetic and independent woman who
- 8 established a legacy of strength, courage, and deep compassion for
- 9 others that will continue to inspire all those who knew and loved
