1 WHEREAS, A life filled with meaningful service drew to a 2 close with the passing of the Honorable Gordon Arnold Jr. of Austin 3 on May 23, 2015, at the age of 65; and

WHEREAS, "Doc" Arnold was born to Marjorie Arnold Sitek and Gordon Arnold on September 8, 1949, in Richmond, Virginia; he attended Baylor University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in political science and a juris doctor degree, and then embarked on a long and successful career in the public arena; following law school, he worked initially as an attorney for the Terrell Independent School District and later for the City of Terrell; and

11 WHEREAS, Desiring to do even more for his community, Mr. Arnold successfully sought election as a state representative 12 in 1982 and held office from 1983 to 1985; during his tenure, he 13 14 served on a number of committees, including the House Calendars Committee and the House Task Force on Indigent Health Care, of which 15 16 he was vice chair; in 1985, he resigned his seat to become chief of staff to speaker of the house of representatives Gib Lewis; 17 Mr. Arnold remained in that post until 1988, when he established a 18 private law practice in Austin; over the ensuing years, he became a 19 20 trusted advisor to clients in legislative, regulatory, and political matters; and 21

22 WHEREAS, Doc Arnold was the devoted husband of Elaine Arnold, 23 with whom he shared a marriage that spanned 26 years, and the loving 24 father of Erin, Jeff, and Kaitlyn; always supportive of his

1 children's interests, he coached Little League Baseball and served 2 as president of the Booster Club at Anderson High School; he also 3 served on several boards, including the McMurry University Board of 4 Trustees; in his spare time, he enjoyed pursuing his passion for 5 history and spending time in the out-of-doors; and

6 WHEREAS, This esteemed Texan achieved a life that was rich in 7 family, friends, and service to his state and his community, and 8 those who were blessed to share in his love and affection will 9 forever hold him close in their hearts; now, therefore, be it
