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- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 9 SECTION 1. Section 58A.001, Education Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 58A.001. DEFINITIONS [DEFINITION]. In this chapter:
- 12 (1) "Board"[____ "board"] means the Texas Higher
- 13 Education Coordinating Board.
- 14 (2) "Center" means the comprehensive health
- 15 professions resource center established under Chapter 105, Health
- 16 and Safety Code.
- 17 "Community-based, ambulatory patient care center"
- 18 includes:
- (A) a federally qualified health center, as
- 20 defined by Section 1905(1)(2)(B), Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
- 21 <u>Section 1396d(1)(2)(B));</u>
- (B) a community mental health center, as defined
- 23 by Section 1861(ff)(3)(B), Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section
- 24 1395x(ff)(3)(B);

1	(C) a rural health clinic, as defined by Section
2	1861(aa)(2), Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section 1395x(aa)(2));
3	and
4	(D) a teaching health center, as defined by 42
5	<pre>U.S.C. Section 2931-1(f)(3)(A).</pre>
6	(4) "First-year residency position" means a residency
7	position offering first year training in a graduate medical
8	education program.
9	(5) "Graduate medical education program" means a
10	nationally accredited post-doctor of medicine (M.D.) or
11	post-doctor of osteopathic medicine (D.O.) program that prepares
12	physicians for the independent practice of medicine in a specific
13	specialty area.
14	(6) "Hospital" means:
15	(A) a facility licensed as a hospital under
16	Chapter 241, Health and Safety Code, or as a mental hospital under
17	Chapter 577, Health and Safety Code; or
18	(B) a similar facility owned or operated by this
19	state or an agency of this state.
20	(7) "Medical school" means a public or independent
21	educational institution that awards a doctor of medicine (M.D.) or
22	doctor of osteopathic medicine (D.O.) degree.
23	(8) "Sponsoring institution" means the entity that
24	assumes the ultimate financial or academic responsibility for a
25	graduate medical education program.

(9) "Teaching hospital" means a hospital that:

(A) is formally affiliated with a medical school

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- 1 for purposes of providing a graduate medical education program; or
- 2 (B) serves as the sponsoring institution for a
- 3 graduate medical education program.
- 4 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 58A, Education Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Sections 58A.002 and 58A.003 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 58A.002. PERMANENT FUND SUPPORTING GRADUATE MEDICAL
- 7 EDUCATION. (a) In this section, "trust company" means the Texas
- 8 Treasury Safekeeping Trust Company.
- 9 (b) The permanent fund supporting graduate medical
- 10 education is a special fund in the treasury outside the general
- 11 revenue fund. The fund is composed of:
- (1) money transferred or appropriated to the fund by
- 13 the legislature;
- 14 (2) gifts and grants contributed to the fund; and
- 15 (3) the returns received from investment of money in
- 16 the fund.
- 17 (c) The trust company shall administer the fund. The trust
- 18 company shall determine the amount available for distribution from
- 19 the fund, determined in accordance with a distribution policy that
- 20 is adopted by the comptroller and designed to preserve the
- 21 purchasing power of the fund's assets and to provide a stable and
- 22 predictable stream of annual distributions. Expenses of managing
- 23 the fund's assets shall be paid from the fund. Except as provided
- 24 by this section, money in the fund may not be used for any purpose.
- 25 Sections 403.095 and 404.071, Government Code, do not apply to the
- 26 fund.
- 27 (d) In managing the assets of the fund, through procedures

- 1 and subject to restrictions the trust company considers
- 2 appropriate, the trust company may acquire, exchange, sell,
- 3 supervise, manage, or retain any kind of investment that a prudent
- 4 investor, exercising reasonable care, skill, and caution, would
- 5 acquire or retain in light of the purposes, terms, distribution
- 6 requirements, and other circumstances of the fund then prevailing,
- 7 taking into consideration the investment of all the assets of the
- 8 fund rather than a single investment.
- 9 <u>(e) The amount available for distribution from the fund may</u>
- 10 be appropriated only:
- 11 (1) to the board to fund the programs created under
- 12 this chapter; or
- 13 (2) as otherwise directed by the legislature.
- 14 (f) A public or private institution of higher education or
- 15 other entity that may receive money under a program described by
- 16 Subsection (e) may solicit and accept gifts and grants to be
- 17 deposited to the credit of the fund. A gift or grant to the fund
- 18 must be distributed and appropriated for the purposes of the fund,
- 19 subject to any limitation or requirement placed on the gift or grant
- 20 by the donor or granting entity.
- Sec. 58A.003. REDUCTION IN FUNDING. (a) The board shall
- 22 <u>limit or withhold funding from any grant recipient under this</u>
- 23 chapter that does not comply with reporting requirements or that
- 24 uses grant funds for a purpose not authorized by this chapter for
- 25 the grant awarded.
- 26 (b) The board shall seek reimbursement with respect to any
- 27 grant funds that are not used for purposes authorized by this

- 1 chapter for the grant awarded.
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 58A.022, Education Code, is amended to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 58A.022. GRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION PLANNING AND
- 5 PARTNERSHIP GRANTS. (a) The board shall award one-time graduate
- 6 medical education planning and partnership grants to hospitals,
- 7 medical schools, and community-based, ambulatory patient care
- 8 centers [entities] located in this state that seek to develop new
- 9 graduate medical education programs with first-year residency
- 10 positions, regardless of whether the grant recipient has previously
- 11 offered[÷
- 12 [(1) have never had] a graduate medical education
- 13 program with first-year residency positions [; and
- 14 [(2) are eligible for Medicare funding of graduate
- 15 medical education].
- 16 (b) The board shall award graduate medical education
- 17 planning and partnership grants on a competitive basis according to
- 18 criteria adopted by the board. The board shall determine the number
- 19 of grants awarded and the amount of each grant consistent with any
- 20 conditions provided by legislative appropriation. A grant received
- 21 under this section must be used for the purpose of planning a new
- 22 graduate medical education program with [additional] first-year
- 23 residency positions.
- 24 (c) A hospital, medical school, or community-based,
- 25 <u>ambulatory patient care center</u> [An application for a planning grant
- 26 for a state fiscal year must be submitted to the board not later
- 27 than July 15 preceding that fiscal year. Not later than August 15,

- 1 the board shall make decisions about grant awards for the following
- 2 state fiscal year.
- 3 [(d) An entity] that is awarded a graduate medical education
- 4 planning and partnership grant and that establishes new first-year
- 5 residency positions after receipt of the grant is eligible to apply
- 6 for additional funds under Section 58A.024 for each such position
- 7 established, as provided by appropriation.
- 8 (d) A hospital, medical school, or community-based,
- 9 ambulatory patient care center may partner with an existing
- 10 graduate medical education program or sponsoring institution for
- 11 purposes of planning a new graduate medical education program using
- 12 grant funds awarded under this section.
- 13 SECTION 4. Section 58A.023, Education Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 58A.023. GRANTS FOR UNFILLED RESIDENCY POSITIONS.
- 16 (a) The board shall award grants to graduate medical education
- 17 programs to enable those programs to fill first-year residency
- 18 positions that are accredited but unfilled as of July 1, 2013
- 19 [first-year residency positions]. The board shall determine the
- 20 number of grants awarded and the amount of each grant consistent
- 21 with any conditions provided by legislative appropriation.
- (b) A grant received under this section must be expended to
- 23 support:
- 24 <u>(1) resident stipends and benefits; and</u>
- 25 (2) other [the] direct resident costs to the program[table 7]
- 26 including the resident stipend and benefits].
- 27 (c) A grant application must include proof of the accredited

- 1 but unfilled positions to which the application applies. [An
- 2 application for a grant must be submitted to the board not later
- 3 than October 1 preceding the period for which the grant is made.
- 4 The board shall make decisions about grant awards not later than
- 5 January 1 preceding the grant period.
- 6 (d) The board may distribute a grant amount for a residency
- 7 position only on receiving verification that the applicable
- 8 residency position has been filled.
- 9 (e) Grant amounts are awarded under this section for the
- 10 duration of the period in which the resident who initially fills the
- 11 residency position continues to hold that position [two consecutive
- 12 state fiscal years. For each first-year residency position for
- 13 which a program receives an initial grant amount in a fiscal year,
- 14 the board shall award the program an equal grant amount for the
- 15 following fiscal year].
- SECTION 5. Section 58A.024, Education Code, is amended to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 58A.024. GRANTS FOR PROGRAM EXPANSION OR NEW PROGRAM.
- 19 (a) The board shall award grants to enable new or existing
- 20 graduate medical education programs to increase the number of
- 21 first-year residency positions [or to provide for the establishment
- 22 of new graduate medical education programs with first-year
- 23 residency positions]. The board shall determine the number of
- 24 grants awarded and the amount of each grant consistent with any
- 25 conditions provided by legislative appropriation.
- 26 (b) [A grant received under this section must be expended to
- 27 support the direct resident costs to the program, including the

1 resident stipend and benefits.

- 2 [(c)] A grant application must include a plan for receiving
- 3 accreditation for the increased number of positions or for the new
- 4 program, as applicable. [An application for a grant must be
- 5 submitted to the board not later than October 1 preceding the period
- 6 for which the grant is made. The board shall make decisions about
- 7 grant awards not later than January 1 preceding the grant period.
- 8 $\underline{\text{(c)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(d)}}{\text{)}}$] The board may distribute a grant amount for a
- 9 residency position only on receiving verification that the
- 10 applicable residency position has been filled.
- 11 $\underline{\text{(d)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(e)}}{\text{)}}$] Grant amounts are awarded under this section for
- 12 the duration of the period in which the resident who initially fills
- 13 the residency position continues to hold that position [three
- 14 consecutive state fiscal years. For each first-year residency
- 15 position for which a program receives an initial grant amount in a
- 16 fiscal year, the board shall award the program an equal grant amount
- 17 for the following two fiscal years].
- 18 SECTION 6. Subchapter B, Chapter 58A, Education Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Sections 58A.0245 and 58A.0246 to read as
- 20 follows:
- 21 <u>Sec. 58A.0245. CRITICAL SHORTAGE LEVELS. (a) If the board</u>
- 22 <u>determines</u> that the number of first-year residency positions
- 23 proposed by eligible applicants under Sections 58A.023 and 58A.024
- 24 <u>exceeds the number of first-year residency positions for which</u>
- 25 grant funding under those sections is appropriated, in awarding
- 26 grants under those sections the board shall prioritize the awarding
- 27 of new grants to medical specialties determined by the board to be

- 1 at critical shortage levels.
- 2 (b) In determining critical shortage levels under this
- 3 section, the board shall consider:
- 4 (1) the available results of research conducted by the
- 5 center under Section 105.009, Health and Safety Code;
- 6 (2) other relevant research and criteria, including
- 7 research and criteria related to the designation of health
- 8 professional shortage areas; and
- 9 (3) research performed by other appropriate entities.
- 10 Sec. 58A.0246. CONTINUATION OF GRANTS AWARDED FOR 2015
- 11 STATE FISCAL YEAR. The board shall award additional grants to fund
- 12 eligible graduate medical education programs that received a grant
- 13 awarded under this subchapter for the state fiscal year ending on
- 14 August 31, 2015, if those programs continue to meet the applicable
- 15 grant requirements that existed at the time of the initial award.
- 16 SECTION 7. Chapter 105, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 17 by adding Section 105.009 to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 105.009. RESEARCH REGARDING GRADUATE MEDICAL
- 19 EDUCATION SYSTEM. (a) The comprehensive health professions
- 20 resource center shall conduct research:
- 21 (1) to identify:
- (A) the ratio of primary care to non-primary care
- 23 physicians that is necessary and appropriate to meet the current
- 24 and future health care needs of this state; and
- 25 (B) all medical specialties and subspecialties
- 26 that are at critical shortage levels in this state, together with
- 27 the geographic location of the physicians in those specialties and

1 subspecialties; and

- 2 (2) regarding the overall supply of physicians in this
- 3 state and any other issues that are relevant to the status of the
- 4 state's graduate medical education system and the ability of that
- 5 system to meet the current and future health care needs of this
- 6 state.
- 7 (b) Not later than May 1 of each even-numbered year, the
- 8 council shall report the results of the center's research to the
- 9 Legislative Budget Board, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating
- 10 Board, the office of the governor, and the standing committees of
- 11 each house of the legislature with primary jurisdiction over state
- 12 finance or appropriations.
- 13 SECTION 8. Chapter 2203, Insurance Code, is amended by
- 14 adding Subchapter J to read as follows:
- 15 SUBCHAPTER J. TRANSFER OF ASSETS; SUSPENSION OF NEW BUSINESS
- Sec. 2203.451. TRANSFER OF ASSETS. (a) Not later than the
- 17 90th day after the effective date of this section, the department
- 18 shall complete an actuarial study to determine the amount of assets
- 19 necessary for:
- 20 (1) the association's known and unknown insurance
- 21 claims and costs associated with those claims; and
- 22 (2) administrative expenses of the association,
- 23 including liabilities for employee retirement plans.
- 24 (b) The association shall cooperate with the department in
- 25 completing the actuarial study required by Subsection (a).
- 26 (c) Not later than the 60th day after the date on which the
- 27 department completes the actuarial study required by Subsection

- 1 (a), the association shall transfer the amount of association
- 2 assets not necessary for the purposes described by Subsection (a)
- 3 to the permanent fund supporting graduate medical education
- 4 established under Section 58A.002, Education Code. If that fund is
- 5 not in existence on the date of transfer, the association shall
- 6 transfer the assets to an account created by the comptroller
- 7 outside of the state treasury, and the comptroller shall hold the
- 8 <u>assets in trust pending creation of the fund.</u>
- 9 Sec. 2203.4515. SUSPENSION OF NEW BUSINESS. (a) Promptly
- 10 after the completion of the actuarial study required by Section
- 11 2203.451, the commissioner, after notice and hearing, shall
- 12 determine whether a necessity exists to suspend the association's
- 13 authority to issue new insurance policies pending a future
- 14 enactment by the legislature that becomes law or the expiration of
- 15 this subchapter under Section 2203.452, whichever occurs earlier.
- 16 (b) If the commissioner determines that a necessity
- 17 described by Subsection (a) exists, the commissioner shall order
- 18 the association to cease issuing new policies immediately, and the
- 19 association may not issue a new policy before the expiration of this
- 20 subchapter under Section 2203.452 unless authorized by a law that
- 21 takes effect before the expiration of this subchapter.
- (c) Notwithstanding any order under this section, the
- 23 association may continue to renew policies in effect immediately
- 24 before the effective date of the order in accordance with the
- 25 association's plan of operation.
- Sec. 2203.452. EXPIRATION OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter
- 27 expires September 1, 2017.

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SECTION 9. The following provisions of the Education Code are repealed:
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- 3 (1) Section 58A.025;
- 4 (2) Section 58A.026; and
- 5 (3) Section 61.511.

SECTION 10. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
