2 relating to training for members of the governing board of a public

- 3 institution of higher education.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 61.084, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a) and (d) and adding Subsections (a-1),
- 7 (a-2), and (h) to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The board by rule shall establish a training program for
- 9 members of the governing boards of institutions of higher
- 10 education. Each member of a governing board of an institution of
- 11 higher education shall attend, during the member's first  $\underline{\text{year}}$  [ $\underline{\text{two}}$
- 12 **years**] of service as a member of a governing board of an institution
- 13 of higher education, at least one training program under this
- 14 section. A member of a governing board who is required to attend a
- 15 training program under this section may attend additional training
- 16 programs under this section.
- 17 <u>(a-1)</u> The board's rules must require a governing board
- 18 member who holds an appointive position to attend, as part of the
- 19 training program, the intensive short orientation course developed
- 20 under Section 61.0841 and any available training course sponsored
- 21 or coordinated by the office of the governor with a curriculum
- 22 designed for training newly appointed state officers, board
- 23 members, or high-level executive officials. The rules must require
- 24 the member to attend those courses the first time they are offered

- 1 following the date the member takes the oath of office, regardless
- 2 of whether that attendance is required under other law. The rules
- 3 may provide a governing board member with additional time to attend
- 4 those courses if the member for good cause is unable to attend the
- 5 courses the first time they are offered. Subsection (g) does not
- 6 apply to the courses required by this subsection.
- 7 (a-2) A member of the governing board of an institution of
- 8 higher education who holds an appointive position and whose first
- 9 year of service on the governing board begins on or after January 1,
- 10 2016, is prohibited from voting on a budgetary or personnel matter
- 11 related to system administration or institutions of higher
- 12 education until the member completes the intensive short
- 13 orientation course described by Subsection (a-1).
- 14 (d) The content of the instruction at the training program
- 15 shall focus on the official role and duties of the members of
- 16 governing boards and shall provide training in the areas of
- 17 budgeting, policy development, ethics, and governance. Topics
- 18 covered by the training program must [may] include:
- 19 (1) auditing procedures and recent audits of
- 20 institutions of higher education;
- 21 (2) the enabling legislation that creates
- 22 institutions of higher education;
- 23 (3) the role of the governing board at institutions of
- 24 higher education and the relationship between the governing board
- 25 and an institution's administration, faculty and staff, and
- 26 students, including limitations on the authority of the governing
- 27 board;

- 1 (4) the mission statements of institutions of higher
- 2 education;
- 3 (5) disciplinary and investigative authority of the
- 4 governing board;
- 5 (6) the requirements of the open meetings law, Chapter
- 6 551, Government Code, and the open records law, Chapter 552,
- 7 Government Code;
- 8 (7) the requirements of conflict of interest laws and
- 9 other laws relating to public officials;
- 10 (8) any applicable ethics policies adopted by
- 11 institutions of higher education or the Texas Ethics Commission;
- 12 (9) the requirements of laws relating to the
- 13 protection of student information under the Family Educational
- 14 Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section 1232g) or any
- 15 other federal or state law relating to the privacy of student
- 16 <u>information;</u> and
- 17 (10) [(9)] any other topic relating to higher
- 18 education the board considers important.
- 19 (h) The board is responsible for documenting governing
- 20 board members' completion of the requirements provided by this
- 21 section.
- 22 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
- 23 amended by adding Section 61.0841 to read as follows:
- Sec. 61.0841. INTENSIVE SHORT COURSE FOR APPOINTED MEMBERS
- 25 OF GOVERNING BOARDS. (a) The board shall develop an intensive
- 26 short orientation course for members of the governing boards of
- 27 institutions of higher education who hold appointive positions.

- 1 The orientation course must be offered as an online interactive
- 2 course and may also be offered in the form of a written document or
- 3 in a one-on-one or group setting.
- 4 (b) The instruction in the orientation course must include:
- 5 (1) best practices relating to excellence,
- 6 transparency, accountability, and efficiency in the governing
- 7 structure and organization of general academic teaching
- 8 institutions and university systems;
- 9 (2) best practices relating to the manner in which
- 10 governing boards and administrators of general academic teaching
- 11 institutions and university systems develop and implement major
- 12 policy decisions, including the need for impartiality and adequate
- 13 internal review in their processes;
- 14 (3) matters relating to excellence, transparency,
- 15 accountability, and efficiency in the governance and
- 16 administration of general academic teaching institutions and
- 17 university systems; and
- 18 (4) ethics, conflicts of interests, and the proper
- 19 role of a board member in the governing structure of general
- 20 <u>academic teaching institutions and university systems.</u>
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect January 1, 2016.
