A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- relating to a study concerning enforcement of following distance 2 laws in this state.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. Chapter 411, Government Code, is amended by 5
- adding Subchapter Z to read as follows: 6

SUBCHAPTER Z. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS 7

- Sec. 411.951. STUDY AND REPORT ON FOLLOWING DISTANCE 8
- 9 ENFORCEMENT. (a) The department shall conduct a study of the
- incidence of, and costs associated with, drivers' failure to 10
- maintain safe following distance as required by Section 545.062, 11
- 12 Transportation Code. At a minimum, the study must:
- 13 (1) determine whether current enforcement methods
- 14 adequately deter violations of Section 545.062, Transportation
- Code; and 15

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- 16 (2) make recommendations concerning ways to enhance
- enforcement methods, if the department determines that current 17
- enforcement methods are inadequate. 18
- (b) In conducting the study described by Subsection (a), the 19
- department may consider the use of technologies such as laser, 20
- radar, or other electronic or mechanical devices that would enable 21
- peace officers to measure the distance between two or more motor 22
- 23 vehicles in motion.
- 24 (c) Not later than January 15, 2017, the department shall

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- 1 submit a report on the results of the study conducted under this
- 2 section to the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 3 representatives, and the presiding officer of each standing
- 4 committee of the legislature with jurisdiction over transportation
- 5 matters. The report must:
- 6 (1) describe the impact that the recommendations made
- 7 under Subsection (a)(2), if any, have, or are predicted to have, on
- 8 the incidence of unsafe following distance in this state; and
- 9 (2) include recommendations for proposed legislation
- 10 appropriate to regulate or mitigate the use of the technologies
- 11 described by Subsection (b), if the recommendations made under
- 12 Subsection (a)(2) include the use of technologies described by
- 13 Subsection (b).
- 14 (d) This section expires August 31, 2017.
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
