## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the resident physician expansion grant program. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Sections 61.511(a), (c), (d), (e), (f), and (j), 5 Education Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 (a) The board shall administer the Resident Physician 7 Expansion Grant Program [as a competitive grant program] to 8 encourage the creation of new graduate medical education positions through community collaboration and innovative funding. The board 9 shall award grants to new or existing physician residency programs 10 at teaching hospitals and other appropriate health care entities 11 12 according to the program criteria established under Subsections (b) and (i). 13 14 (c) The board may provide grants only to support a residency position that: 15 (1)16 is created and accredited on or after July [January] 1, 2016 [2014]; or 17 18 (2) was created and accredited before <u>July</u> [January] 1, 2015 [2013], but as of that date had not yet been filled. 19 (d) A grant award may be used only to pay direct costs 20 21 associated with the position, including the creation and maintenance of the position and the salary of the resident 22 23 physician. 24 (e) Each grant application must specify:

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2 created <u>or maintained</u> with the grant money; and
3 (2) the grant amount requested for each year.

4 (f) The board by rule shall ensure that [award] grants are 5 awarded for each [all] residency position for which a grant was [positions] awarded [a grant under this section] in the preceding 6 year [before awarding a grant for a residency position that did not 7 8 receive a grant in the preceding year], until the resident in that position in the preceding year has completed the requirements of 9 10 the position and provided that the applicable grant recipient from the preceding year complies with all conditions of the grant as 11 described by Subsection (g). 12

(j) Not later than <u>March</u> [January] 1 of each <u>even-numbered</u> year, the board shall prepare and submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, the standing committees of the senate and house of representatives with responsibility for oversight of health and human services issues, and the Legislative Budget Board a report that:

19 (1) specifies each of the following with respect to20 the preceding program year:

21 (A) the number of grants awarded under the 22 program;

(B) the amount of each grant awarded under theprogram;

(C) the number of residency positions createdwith the support of grant money;

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(D) the medical specialty of the residency

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positions created; and (E) whether physicians who complete their training through residency positions created under the program choose to practice in this state and which medical specialties they choose for their practices; and (2) makes appropriate recommendations for legislative changes as necessary. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
