A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to mental health first aid training for school district
- 3 employees and school resource officers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1001.201, Health and Safety Code, as
- 6 added by Chapter 1306 (H.B. 3793), Acts of the 83rd Legislature,
- 7 Regular Session, 2013, is amended by adding Subdivisions (4) and
- 8 (5) to read as follows:
- 9 (4) "School district employee" means a principal,
- 10 assistant principal, educator, teacher's aide, counselor, nurse,
- 11 or school bus driver employed by a school district.
- 12 (5) "School resource officer" has the meaning assigned
- 13 by Section 1701.601, Occupations Code.
- SECTION 2. Sections 1001.203(a) and (c), Health and Safety
- 15 Code, as added by Chapter 1306 (H.B. 3793), Acts of the 83rd
- 16 Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, are amended to read as follows:
- 17 (a) To the extent funds are appropriated to the department
- 18 for that purpose, the department shall make grants to local mental
- 19 health authorities to provide an approved mental health first aid
- 20 training program, administered by mental health first aid trainers,
- 21 at no cost to school district employees and school resource
- 22 officers [educators].
- (c) Subject to the limit provided by Subsection (b), out of
- 24 the funds appropriated to the department for making grants under

- 1 this section, the department shall grant \$100 to a local mental
- 2 health authority for each school district employee or school
- 3 $\underline{\text{resource officer}}$ [$\underline{\text{educator}}$] who successfully completes a mental
- 4 health first aid training program provided by the authority under
- 5 this section.
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 1001.205, Health and Safety Code, as
- 7 added by Chapter 1306 (H.B. 3793), Acts of the 83rd Legislature,
- 8 Regular Session, 2013, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1001.205. REPORTS. (a) Not later than <u>August 31</u>
- 10 [July 1] of each year, a local mental health authority shall provide
- 11 to the department the number of:
- 12 (1) employees and contractors of the authority who
- 13 were trained as mental health first aid trainers under Section
- 14 1001.202 during the preceding calendar year;
- 15 (2) educators, school district employees other than
- 16 <u>educators</u>, and school resource officers who completed a mental
- 17 health first aid training program offered by the authority under
- 18 Section 1001.203 during the preceding calendar year; and
- 19 (3) individuals who are not school district employees
- 20 <u>or school resource officers</u> [<u>educators</u>] who completed a mental
- 21 health first aid training program offered by the authority during
- 22 the preceding calendar year.
- 23 (b) Not later than September 30 [August 1] of each year, the
- 24 department shall compile the information submitted by local mental
- 25 health authorities as required by Subsection (a) and submit a
- 26 report to the legislature containing the number of:
- 27 (1) authority employees and contractors trained as

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- 1 mental health first aid trainers <u>during the preceding calendar</u>
- 2 year;
- 3 (2) educators, school district employees other than
- 4 educators, and school resource officers who completed a mental
- 5 health first aid training program provided by an authority during
- 6 the preceding calendar year; and
- 7 (3) individuals who are not <u>school district employees</u>
- 8 <u>or school resource officers</u> [<u>educators</u>] who completed a mental
- 9 health first aid training program provided by an authority during
- 10 the preceding calendar year.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
