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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to exempting textbooks purchased, used, or consumed by university and college students from the sales and use tax for 3 limited periods. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 151, Tax Code, is amended 7 by adding Section 151.3211 to read as follows: Sec. 151.3211. TEXTBOOKS PURCHASED, USED, OR CONSUMED BY 8 UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE STUDENTS FOR LIMITED PERIODS. (a) The 9 sale, use, or consumption of a book written, designed, and produced 10 for educational, instructional, or pedagogical purposes is 11 12 exempted from the taxes imposed by this chapter if: 13 (1) the book is purchased by a full-time or part-time 14 student enrolled at an institution of higher education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, or a private or independent 15 college or university that is located in this state and that is 16 accredited by a recognized accrediting agency as defined by Section 17 61.003, Education Code; and 18 (2) the purchase takes place at or after 12:01 a.m. on 19 the first day, but at or before 12 midnight on the last day, of an 20 exemption period designated by the comptroller under Subsection 21 (b). 22 23 (b) The comptroller shall designate seven consecutive days in January and seven consecutive days in August of each year during 24

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which the exemption authorized by this section is effective. The 1 comptroller shall designate each exemption period for the time in 2 the relevant month when the greatest number of books described by 3 Subsection (a) is likely to be purchased, as determined by the 4 comptroller based on a review of the academic calendars of the 5 institutions of higher education, colleges, and universities 6 described by Subsection (a)(1). The comptroller shall designate the 7 8 exemption period in a manner and at a time that provides reasonable notice of the exemption period to retailers and the public. 9

10 (c) A person may establish that the person is a full-time or 11 part-time student by presenting a valid student identification 12 card. The comptroller by rule shall prescribe the manner in which a 13 person may electronically establish, when making an online 14 purchase, that the person is a full-time or part-time student.

15 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act does not 16 affect taxes imposed before the effective date of this Act, and the 17 law in effect before the effective date of this Act is continued in 18 effect for purposes of the liability for and collection of those 19 taxes.

20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect July 1, 2015, if it 21 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 22 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 23 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for effect on that 24 date, this Act takes effect October 1, 2015.

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
