A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to student loan repayment assistance for certain mental
3	health professionals.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter K to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER K. REPAYMENT OF CERTAIN MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL
8	EDUCATION LOANS
9	Sec. 61.601. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "mental
10	health professional" means:
11	(1) a licensed physician who is certified in
12	psychiatry by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology;
13	(2) a psychologist, as defined by Section 501.002,
14	Occupations Code;
15	(3) a licensed professional counselor, as defined by
16	Section 503.002, Occupations Code;
17	(4) an advanced practice registered nurse, as defined
18	by Section 301.152, Occupations Code, who holds a nationally
19	recognized board certification in psychiatric or mental health
20	nursing; and
21	(5) a licensed clinical social worker, as defined by
22	Section 505.002, Occupations Code.
23	Sec. 61.602. REPAYMENT AUTHORIZED. The board shall
24	establish a program to provide, using funds appropriated for that

- 1 purpose and in accordance with this subchapter and rules of the
- 2 board, assistance in the repayment of student loans for mental
- 3 health professionals who apply and qualify for the assistance.
- 4 Sec. 61.603. ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to receive
- 5 repayment assistance under this subchapter, a mental health
- 6 professional must:
- 7 (1) apply to the board;
- 8 <u>(2) have completed one, two, three, four, or five</u>
- 9 consecutive years of practice in a health professional shortage
- 10 area designated by the Department of State Health Services; and
- 11 (3) provide mental health services in this state to:
- 12 (A) recipients under the medical assistance
- 13 program authorized by Chapter 32, Human Resources Code;
- 14 (B) enrollees under the child health plan program
- 15 <u>authorized by Chapter 62, Health and Safety Code; or</u>
- (C) persons committed to a secure correctional
- 17 facility operated by or under contract with the Texas Juvenile
- 18 Justice Department or persons confined in a secure correctional
- 19 facility operated by or under contract with any division of the
- 20 Texas Department of Criminal Justice.
- Sec. 61.604. LIMITATIONS. (a) A mental health
- 22 professional may receive repayment assistance under this
- 23 <u>subchapter for not more than five years.</u>
- (b) Not more than 10 percent of the number of repayment
- 25 assistance grants paid under this subchapter each year may be
- 26 awarded to mental health professionals providing mental health
- 27 services described by Section 61.603(3)(C).

- 1 (c) Not more than 30 percent of the number of repayment
- 2 assistance grants paid under this subchapter each year may be
- 3 awarded to mental health professionals in any one of the
- 4 professions listed in Section 61.601.
- 5 Sec. 61.605. ELIGIBLE LOANS. (a) The board may provide
- 6 repayment assistance under this subchapter for the repayment of any
- 7 student loan for education at an institution of higher education, a
- 8 private or independent institution of higher education, or a public
- 9 or private out-of-state institution of higher education accredited
- 10 by a recognized accrediting agency, including loans for
- 11 undergraduate education, received by an eligible person through any
- 12 lender.
- 13 (b) The board may not provide repayment assistance for a
- 14 student loan that is in default at the time of the person's
- 15 <u>application</u>.
- 16 <u>(c) In each state fiscal biennium, the board shall attempt</u>
- 17 to allocate all funds appropriated to the board for the purpose of
- 18 providing loan repayment assistance under this subchapter.
- 19 Sec. 61.606. REPAYMENT. (a) The board shall deliver any
- 20 repayment under this subchapter in a lump sum payable:
- 21 (1) to both the lender or other holder of the loan and
- 22 the mental health professional; or
- 23 (2) directly to the lender or other holder of the loan
- 24 on the mental health professional's behalf.
- 25 (b) A repayment under this subchapter may be applied to any
- 26 amount due in connection with the loan.
- Sec. 61.607. AMOUNT OF REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE. (a) A mental

- 1 health professional may receive repayment assistance under this
- 2 subchapter for each year the mental health professional establishes
- 3 eligibility for the assistance in an amount determined by applying
- 4 the following applicable percentage to the maximum total amount of
- 5 assistance allowed for the mental health professional under
- 6 Subsection (b):
- 7 (1) for the first year, 10 percent;
- 8 (2) for the second year, 15 percent;
- 9 (3) for the third year, 20 percent;
- 10 (4) for the fourth year, 25 percent; and
- 11 (5) for the fifth year, 30 percent.
- 12 (b) The total amount of repayment assistance received by a
- 13 mental health professional under this subchapter may not exceed:
- 14 (1) \$160,000, for assistance received by a licensed
- 15 physician;
- 16 (2) \$80,000, for assistance received by a
- 17 psychologist, a licensed professional counselor, or an advanced
- 18 practice registered nurse; and
- 19 (3) \$40,000, for assistance received by a licensed
- 20 clinical social worker.
- 21 (c) The total amount of repayment assistance provided under
- 22 this subchapter may not exceed the sum of:
- (1) the total amount of gifts and grants accepted by
- 24 the board for the repayment assistance;
- 25 (2) legislative appropriations for the repayment
- 26 assistance; and
- 27 (3) other funds available to the board for the

- 1 repayment assistance.
- 2 (d) The board may adjust in an equitable manner the
- 3 distribution amounts that mental health professionals would
- 4 otherwise receive under Subsection (a) for a year as necessary to
- 5 comply with Subsection (c).
- 6 Sec. 61.608. RULES. (a) The board shall adopt rules
- 7 necessary to administer this subchapter.
- 8 (b) The board shall distribute to each institution of higher
- 9 education or private or independent institution of higher education
- 10 and to any appropriate state agency and professional association
- 11 copies of the rules adopted under this section and other pertinent
- 12 information relating to this subchapter.
- Sec. 61.609. SOLICITATION AND ACCEPTANCE OF FUNDS. The
- 14 board may solicit and accept gifts and grants from any public or
- 15 private source for the purposes of this subchapter.
- 16 SECTION 2. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 17 shall adopt the rules for repayment assistance under Subchapter K,
- 18 Chapter 61, Education Code, as added by this Act, not later than
- 19 December 1, 2015.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
