## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to making a voluntary contribution to the Special Olympics
- 3 Texas fund when registering a motor vehicle or renewing a motor
- 4 vehicle registration.

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 502, Transportation Code,
- 7 is amended by adding Section 502.413 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 502.413. VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION TO SPECIAL OLYMPICS
- 9 TEXAS FUND. (a) When a person registers or renews the
- 10 registration of a motor vehicle under this chapter, the person may
- 11 contribute any amount to the Special Olympics Texas fund under
- 12 Subsection (f).
- 13 (b) The department shall provide, in a conspicuous manner,
- 14 an opportunity to contribute to the Special Olympics Texas fund in
- 15 any registration renewal system used by the department.
- 16 (c) If a person makes a contribution under this section and
- 17 does not pay the full amount of a registration fee, the county
- 18 assessor-collector may credit all or a portion of the contribution
- 19 to the person's registration fee.
- 20 (d) The county assessor-collector shall send any
- 21 contribution made under this section to the comptroller for deposit
- 22 to the Special Olympics Texas fund before the 31st day after the
- 23 date the contribution is made.
- (e) The department shall consult with the Department of

- 1 Aging and Disability Services in performing the department's duties
- 2 under this section.
- 3 (f) The Special Olympics Texas fund is created as a trust
- 4 fund outside the state treasury to be held by the comptroller and
- 5 administered by the Department of Aging and Disability Services as
- 6 trustee on behalf of Special Olympics Texas. The fund is composed
- 7 of money deposited to the credit of the fund under this section.
- 8 Money in the fund shall be disbursed at least monthly, without
- 9 appropriation, to Special Olympics Texas to provide training and
- 10 athletic competitions for persons with mental illness and
- 11 <u>intellectual disabilities</u>.
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect January 1, 2016.
