A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to health education curriculum and instruction in public
- 3 schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that:
- 6 (1) Texas led the nation in 2010 in the rate of teenage
- 7 mothers who had second children, according to the Centers for
- 8 Disease Control and Prevention;
- 9 (2) approximately 22 percent of births in Texas by
- 10 girls age 15 to 19 were repeat births in 2010, compared to 18.3
- 11 percent in the United States;
- 12 (3) an estimated 82 percent of teen births are
- 13 unintended and cost American taxpayers approximately \$9.4 billion a
- 14 year and cost Texas taxpayers \$1.1 billion in 2010, according to the
- 15 National Campaign to Prevent Teen and Unplanned Pregnancy;
- 16 (4) the only certain way to avoid the termination of an
- 17 unwanted pregnancy is to prevent the unwanted pregnancy;
- 18 (5) the state has a compelling state interest in
- 19 ensuring that there is appropriate knowledge of how a pregnancy
- 20 occurs and how a pregnancy can be avoided; and
- 21 (6) according to the Centers for Disease Control and
- 22 Prevention, effective strategies to prevent teen pregnancy include
- 23 evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention programs that address
- 24 specific protective factors based on knowledge, skills, beliefs, or

- 1 attitudes related to teen pregnancy, including knowledge of sexual
- 2 issues, sexually transmitted diseases, infection with human
- 3 immunodeficiency virus, acquired immune deficiency syndrome,
- 4 pregnancy, and methods of pregnancy prevention.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 28.004, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (e) and adding Subsection (o) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (e) Any course materials and instruction relating to human
- 9 sexuality, sexually transmitted diseases, or human
- 10 immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome
- 11 shall be selected by the board of trustees with the advice of the
- 12 local school health advisory council and must:
- 13 (1) be evidence-based;
- 14 (2) present abstinence from sexual activity as the
- 15 preferred choice of behavior in relationship to all sexual activity
- 16 for unmarried persons of school age;
- (3) $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ devote more attention to abstinence from
- 18 sexual activity than to any other behavior;
- (4) $[\frac{(3)}{(3)}]$ emphasize that abstinence from sexual
- 20 activity, if used consistently and correctly, is the only method
- 21 that is 100 percent effective in preventing pregnancy, sexually
- 22 transmitted diseases, infection with human immunodeficiency virus,
- 23 [or] acquired immune deficiency syndrome, and the emotional trauma
- 24 associated with adolescent sexual activity;
- (5) $[\frac{(4)}{(4)}]$ direct adolescents to a standard of behavior
- 26 in which abstinence from sexual activity before marriage is the
- 27 most effective way to prevent pregnancy, sexually transmitted

- 1 diseases, [and] infection with human immunodeficiency virus, and
- 2 [or] acquired immune deficiency syndrome; and
- 3 (6) $[\frac{(5)}{(5)}]$ teach contraception and condom use in terms
- 4 of human use reality rates instead of theoretical laboratory rates,
- 5 if instruction on contraception and condoms is included in
- 6 curriculum content.
- 7 (o) In this section, "evidence-based" means information
- 8 verified or supported by research that is:
- 9 (1) conducted in compliance with accepted scientific
- 10 methods;
- 11 (2) published in peer-reviewed journals, if
- 12 appropriate;
- 13 (3) recognized as medically accurate, objective, and
- 14 complete by mainstream professional organizations and agencies
- 15 with expertise in the relevant field, including the federal Centers
- 16 for Disease Control and Prevention and the United States Department
- 17 of Health and Human Services; and
- 18 (4) proven through rigorous scientific evaluation to
- 19 achieve positive outcomes on measures of sexual risk behavior or
- 20 its health consequences.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016
- 22 school year.
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
