2	relating to the essential knowledge and skills of the required
3	public school curriculum, the administration of and reports
4	relating to assessment instruments administered to public school
5	students, the instructional materials allotment, and proclamations
6	for the production of instructional materials.
7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
8	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
9	amended by adding Section 28.0025 to read as follows:
10	Sec. 28.0025. REVIEW AND MODIFICATION OF ESSENTIAL
11	KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS. (a) The State Board of Education shall:
12	(1) conduct a review of the essential knowledge and
13	skills of each foundation curriculum subject under Section
14	28.002(a)(1) that were most recently revised by the board with an
15	effective date before September 1, 2012; and
16	(2) modify the essential knowledge and skills of each
17	foundation curriculum subject reviewed under Subdivision (1) to
18	narrow the content and scope of standards and skills for the subject
19	at each grade level in accordance with this section.
20	(b) In complying with this section, the State Board of
21	Education shall consider:
22	(1) at each grade level for each subject reviewed
23	under this section, the time:
24	(A) a teacher would require to provide

comprehensive instruction on a particular standard or skill; and 1 2 (B) a typical student would require to master a particular standard or skill; 3 4 (2) whether, in light of the consideration required by Subdivision (1), each essential knowledge and skill of a subject 5 reviewed under this section can be comprehensively taught within 6 7 the number of school days required under Section 25.081, not including the number of days required for testing; 8 9 (3) the college and career readiness standards, and whether inclusion of part of those standards in the essential 10 11 knowledge and skills of a subject reviewed under this section is possible; and 12 13 (4) whether an assessment instrument administered 14 under Section 39.023 adequately assesses a particular standard or skill. 15 16 (c) In establishing or following an established timeline for reviewing and modifying the essential knowledge and skills as 17 required under this section, the State Board of Education shall 18 ensure that the timeline reflects a priority to first review and 19 20 modify a subject for which an end-of-course assessment instrument under Section 39.023(c) is administered before a subject for which 21 an assessment instrument under Section 39.023(a) is administered. 22 The board shall complete the review and modification of the 23 essential knowledge and skills at each grade level for each 24 applicable subject as required under this section not later than 25 September 1, 2018. 26 27 (d) The review and modification of the essential knowledge

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and skills for the foundation curriculum conducted by the State 1 2 Board of Education under this section may not result in a need for the adoption of new instructional materials in any subject other 3 4 than English language arts. 5 (e) Until the review and modification under this section is complete, the State Board of Education may not add to or modify the 6 7 content and scope of standards and skills for any subject in the foundation curriculum under Section 28.002(a)(1) reviewed under 8 9 this section unless modifications are made in accordance with this section. 10 11 (f) This section expires September 1, 2018. 12 SECTION 2. Section 28.008(d), Education Code, is amended to 13 read as follows: The State Board of Education shall incorporate college 14 (d) readiness standards and expectations approved by the commissioner 15 16 of education and the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board under Subsection (b) into the essential knowledge and skills 17 identified by the board under Section 28.002(c). The State Board of 18 Education shall develop a chart that clearly indicates the 19 20 alignment of the college readiness standards and expectations with the essential knowledge and skills identified by the board under 21 Section 28.002(c). 22 SECTION 3. Section 31.002, Education Code, is amended by 23 adding Subdivision (1-b) to read as follows: 24 25 (1-b) "Proclamation" means a request for production of instructional materials issued by the State Board of Education. 26 27 SECTION 4. Sections 31.0211(a) and (d), Education Code, are

1 amended to read as follows:

(a) A school district is entitled to an [annual] allotment 2 each biennium from the state instructional materials fund for each 3 4 student enrolled in the district on a date during the last year of [school year] specified 5 the preceding biennium by the commissioner. The commissioner shall determine the amount of the 6 allotment per student each <u>biennium</u> [year] on the basis of the 7 amount of money available in the state instructional materials fund 8 9 to fund the allotment. An allotment under this section shall be transferred from the state instructional materials fund to the 10 11 credit of the district's instructional materials account as provided by Section 31.0212. 12

13 (d) Each <u>biennium</u> [year] a school district shall use the 14 district's allotment under this section to purchase, in the 15 following order:

16 (1) instructional materials necessary to permit the 17 district to certify that the district has instructional materials 18 that cover all elements of the essential knowledge and skills of the 19 required curriculum, other than physical education, for each grade 20 level as required by Section 28.002; and

(2) any other instructional materials ortechnological equipment as determined by the district.

23 SECTION 5. Section 31.0212(a), Education Code, is amended 24 to read as follows:

(a) The commissioner shall maintain an instructional
 materials account for each school district. <u>In the first year of</u>
 <u>each biennium</u> [Each school year], the commissioner shall deposit in

1 the account for each district the amount of the district's
2 instructional materials allotment under Section 31.0211.

3 SECTION 6. Sections 31.0215(a) and (b), Education Code, are 4 amended to read as follows:

5 (a) The commissioner shall, as early as practicable during 6 each <u>biennium</u> [fiscal year], notify each school district and 7 open-enrollment charter school of the estimated amount to which the 8 district or charter school will be entitled under Section 31.0211 9 during the next fiscal biennium [year].

10 The commissioner may allow a school district (b) or 11 open-enrollment charter school to place an order for instructional 12 materials before the beginning of a fiscal biennium [year] and to 13 receive instructional materials before payment. The commissioner shall limit the cost of an order placed under this section to 80 14 15 percent of the estimated amount to which a school district or 16 open-enrollment charter school is estimated to be entitled as provided by Subsection (a) and shall first credit any balance in a 17 district or charter school instructional materials account to pay 18 for an order placed under this section. 19

20 SECTION 7. Section 31.022, Education Code, is amended by 21 adding Subsections (b-1), (b-2), and (b-3) and amending Subsection 22 (f) to read as follows:

23 (b-1) For any state fiscal biennium, the board may only 24 issue proclamations for instructional materials in which the total 25 projected cost of instructional materials under the proclamations 26 does not exceed 75 percent of the total amount used to fund the 27 instructional materials allotment under Section 31.0211 for that

1	biennium.
2	(b-2) Following the adoption of revised essential knowledge
3	and skills for any subject, the board shall determine whether
4	issuance of a proclamation is necessary based on the significance
5	of the changes to the essential knowledge and skills. If the board
6	determines a proclamation is necessary, the board shall issue:
7	(1) a full call for instructional materials aligned to
8	all of the essential knowledge and skills for the subject and grade
9	<pre>level;</pre>
10	(2) a supplemental call for instructional materials
11	aligned to new or expanded essential knowledge and skills for the
12	subject and grade level;
13	(3) a call for new information demonstrating alignment
14	of current instructional materials to the revised essential
15	knowledge and skills; or
16	(4) any combination of the calls described by
17	Subdivisions (1), (2), and (3).
18	(b-3) In determining the disbursement of money to the
19	available school fund and the amount of that disbursement that will
20	be used, in accordance with Section 43.001(d), to fund the
21	instructional materials allotment under Section 31.0211, the board
22	must consider the cost of all instructional materials and
23	technology requirements for that state fiscal biennium.
24	(f) The board shall amend any <u>proclamation</u> [request for
25	production] issued for the purchase of instructional materials to
26	conform to the instructional materials funding levels provided by
27	the General Appropriations Act for the year of implementation and

1 to comply with Subsection (b-1).

2 SECTION 8. Subchapter B, Chapter 39, Education Code, is 3 amended by adding Section 39.0239 to read as follows:

<u>Sec. 39.0239. REQUIRED REPORT FOR CERTAIN ASSESSMENTS.</u>
(a) Following the administration of an assessment instrument
adopted or developed under Section 39.023(a), the agency shall
provide a detailed report of a student's performance on the
assessment instrument to:

(1) the student;

- 10 (2) the student's parent or other person standing in 11 parental relationship; and
- 12

(3) the student's teachers.

13 (b) The report provided under Subsection (a) must include an 14 analysis of a student's performance on each assessed standard or 15 skill in the essential knowledge and skills of the subject for which 16 the assessment instrument was administered. The analysis must 17 indicate whether the student mastered each standard or skill 18 assessed in the assessment instrument.

19 (c) The analysis under Subsection (b) must demonstrate both 20 individual assessment results and assessment results aggregated 21 across classes, campuses, and districts.

22 (d) If the commissioner contracts with a third party for the 23 development or adoption of an assessment instrument under Section 24 <u>39.023(a)</u>, the contract must require the third party to fulfill the 25 requirements of this section.

26 SECTION 9. Section 43.001(d), Education Code, is amended to 27 read as follows:

1 (d) Each <u>biennium</u> [year] the State Board of Education shall 2 set aside an amount equal to 50 percent of the [annual] distribution 3 for that <u>biennium</u> [year] from the permanent school fund to the 4 available school fund as provided by Section 5(a), Article VII, 5 Texas Constitution, to be placed, subject to the General 6 Appropriations Act, in the state instructional materials fund 7 established under Section 31.021.

8 SECTION 10. Section 403.093(d), Government Code, is amended 9 to read as follows:

10 The comptroller shall transfer from the general revenue (d) fund to the foundation school fund an amount of money necessary to 11 fund the foundation school program as provided by Chapter 42, 12 13 Education Code. The comptroller shall make the transfers in installments as necessary to comply with Section 42.259, Education 14 Code, and permit the Texas Education Agency, to the extent 15 16 authorized by the General Appropriations Act, to make temporary transfers from the foundation school fund for payment of the 17 instructional materials allotment under Section 31.0211, Education 18 Code. Unless an earlier date is necessary for purposes of temporary 19 20 transfers for payment of the instructional materials allotment, an [An] installment must be made not earlier than two days before the 21 22 date an installment to school districts is required by Section 42.259, Education Code, and must not exceed the amount necessary 23 24 for that payment and any temporary transfers for payment of the 25 instructional materials allotment.

26 SECTION 11. Sections 31.101(d) and (e), Education Code, are 27 repealed.

1 SECTION 12. Not later than January 1, 2016, the State Board 2 of Education shall develop a chart as prescribed by Section 3 28.008(d), Education Code, as amended by this Act.

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SECTION 13. The change in law made by Section 39.0239(d), Education Code, as added by this Act, applies only to a contract entered into, amended, or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. A contract entered into, amended, or renewed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 14. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016 school year.

13 SECTION 15. This Act takes effect immediately if it 14 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 15 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 16 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate 17 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
