4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 16.01(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(a) Except as provided by Section 16.011, the holder of a
8	winery permit may:
9	(1) manufacture, bottle, label, and package wine
10	containing not more than 24 percent alcohol by volume;
11	(2) manufacture fruit brandy and:
12	(A) use that brandy on the winery permit holder's
13	permitted premises for fortifying purposes only; or

- 14 (B) sell that brandy to other winery permit
- 15 holders;
- 16 (3) import or buy fruit brandy from a permit holder
- 17 authorized to manufacture fruit brandy and use that brandy on the
- 18 winery permit holder's permitted premises for fortifying purposes
- 19 only;
- 20 (4) sell wine in this state to or buy wine from permit
- 21 holders authorized to purchase and sell wine, including holders of
- 22 wholesaler's permits, winery permits, and wine bottler's permits;
- 23 (5) sell wine to ultimate consumers[÷
- [(A)] for consumption on the winery premises;

- 1 (6) sell wine manufactured or bottled by the winery
- 2 permit holder to ultimate consumers in unbroken packages for
- 3 off-premises consumption in an amount not to exceed 155,000 gallons
- 4 <u>annually;</u>
- 5 (7) sell wine that is not manufactured or bottled by
- 6 the winery permit holder to ultimate consumers [or
- 7 [(B)] in unbroken packages for off-premises
- 8 consumption in an amount not to exceed 25,000 [35,000] gallons
- 9 annually;
- 10 (8) $\left[\frac{(6)}{(6)}\right]$ sell the wine outside this state to
- 11 qualified persons;
- 12 (9) $\left[\frac{(7)}{(7)}\right]$ blend wines;
- (10) $[\frac{(8)}{(8)}]$ dispense free wine for consumption on the
- 14 winery premises; and
- (11) $[\frac{(9)}{}]$ purchase and import wine from the holder
- 16 of a nonresident seller's permit.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 54.02, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 54.02. PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES. The holder of an
- 20 out-of-state winery direct shipper's permit may not:
- 21 (1) sell or ship wine to a minor;
- 22 (2) deliver wine to a consumer using a carrier that
- 23 does not hold a carrier's permit under this code;
- 24 (3) deliver to the same consumer in this state more
- 25 than nine gallons of wine within any calendar month or more than 36
- 26 gallons of wine within any 12-month period; or
- 27 (4) sell to ultimate consumers more than 155,000

- 1 [35,000] gallons of wine annually.
