9	establish the Advisory Committee on Suicide Prevention.
10	Sec. 1001.302. MEMBERS. (a) The Advisory Committee on
11	Suicide Prevention is composed of not more than 26 members
12	appointed by the commissioner as provided by this section.
13	(b) The advisory committee must include:
14	(1) one member who is a representative of the
15	department's Mental Health and Substance Abuse Division;
16	(2) one member who represents law enforcement;
17	(3) one member who represents institutions of higher
18	education;
19	(4) one member who represents primary and secondary
20	<pre>schools;</pre>
21	(5) one member who is a representative of an employee
22	assistance program or human resources department in the private
23	<pre>sector;</pre>
24	(6) one member who is a licensed mental health

2	(7) one member who is an active member or veteran of
3	the United States military and who has been affected by suicide;
4	(8) one member who is a family member of a person who
5	<pre>committed suicide;</pre>

9	philanthropic foundation;
10	(11) one member who represents medical providers and
11	first responders;
12	(12) one member who is a representative of a hospital
13	with an on-site emergency department;
14	(13) one member who represents the agricultural and

16	(14) one member who represents the oil and gas
17	industry and who is from a rural area;
18	(15) three members who represent the business
19	community, including one member who is from a rural area;

25	interfaith organization.
26	(c) In making the appointments to the advisory committee,
27	the commissioner shall ensure that the membership of the committee

No. 388 1 reflects the ethnic diversity of this state and includes: 2 (1) representatives of the regions of the state with 3 high rates of suicide, including rural areas; and 4 (2) persons who have expertise in those groups 5 associated with high rates of suicide and attempted suicide, 6 including: 7 (A) persons with disabilities; 8 (B) working-age men; 9 (C) elderly persons; 10 (D) active-duty military personnel and veterans; 11 and 12 (E) youth and adults who identify as lesbian, 13 gay, bisexual, or transgender. 14 (d) The commissioner shall appoint one advisory committee 15 member who represents the public sector and one advisory committee member who represents the private sector to serve as co-chairs of 16 17 the committee. Sec. 1001.303. COMPENSATION; REIMBURSEMENT. A member of 18 19 the Advisory Committee on Suicide Prevention may not receive compensation but is entitled to reimbursement of the travel 20 expenses incurred by the member while conducting the business of 21 22 the advisory committee, as provided by the General Appropriations 23 Act. 24 Sec. 1001.304. PURPOSE; DUTIES. (a) The Advisory Committee on Suicide Prevention is established to provide public 25 26 and private leadership for suicide prevention and intervention in 27 this state.

2	plans at the local level.
3	Sec. 1001.305. DEPARTMENT SUPPORT. The department shall
4	support the Advisory Committee on Suicide Prevention by:
5	(1) coordinating the logistics and developing the
6	agenda for advisory committee meetings;
7	(2) following up with advisory committee members after
8	advisory committee meetings;
9	(3) developing and implementing an orientation
10	program for new advisory committee members;
11	(4) working with the advisory committee co-chairs to
12	set priorities for the advisory committee, recruit members for the
13	advisory committee, oversee advisory committee initiatives,
14	coordinate advisory committee activities, and implement advisory
15	committee-directed initiatives; and
16	(5) providing any other support, services, or
17	resources requested by the advisory committee co-chairs.
18	Sec. 1001.306. REPORT. Not later than December 1 of each
19	year, the Advisory Committee on Suicide Prevention shall report to
20	the legislature on the advisory committee's recommendations for
21	suicide prevention and intervention in this state.
22	SECTION 2. Not later than November 1, 2015, the Department
23	of State Health Services shall establish the Advisory Committee on
24	Suicide Prevention as required by Subchapter J, Chapter 1001,
25	Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
26	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
