## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the aerospace and aviation office of the Texas Economic
- 3 Development and Tourism Office and to the aerospace and aviation
- 4 advisory committee.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 481.0066, Government Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsections (d) and (e) and adding Subsections (d-1),
- 8 (d-2), (e-1), and (e-2) to read as follows:
- 9 (d) The aerospace and aviation office shall:
- 10 (1) analyze space-related and aviation-related
- 11 research currently conducted in this state and may conduct
- 12 activities designed to further that research;
- 13 (2) analyze the state's economic position in the
- 14 aerospace and aviation industries;
- 15 (3) develop short-term and long-term business
- 16 strategies as part of an industry-specific strategic plan to
- 17 promote the retention, development, and expansion of aerospace and
- 18 aviation industry facilities in the state that is consistent with
- 19 and complementary of the office strategic plan;
- 20 (4) make specific recommendations to the legislature
- 21 and the governor regarding the promotion of those industries;
- 22 (5) as part of and to further the purposes of the
- 23 industry-specific strategic plan described by Subdivision (3),
- 24 develop short-term and long-term policy initiatives or recommend

reforms the state may undertake or implement to: 1 2 (A) increase investment in aero<u>space</u> and aviation activities; 3 4 (B) support the retention, development, and expansion of spaceports in this state; 5 (C) <u>identify</u> and <u>encourage</u> 6 educational, 7 economic, and defense-related opportunities for aerospace and aviation activities; 8 9 (D) determine the appropriate level of funding for the spaceport trust fund created under Section 481.0069 and 10 support ongoing projects that have been assisted by the fund, 11 including recommending to the legislature an appropriate funding 12 13 level for the fund; (E) partner with the Texas Higher Education 14 15 Coordinating Board to foster technological advancement and 16 economic development for spaceport activities by strengthening 17 higher education programs and supporting aerospace activities; and 18 (F) partner with the Texas Workforce Commission to support initiatives that address the high technology skills and 19 20 staff resources needed to better promote the state's efforts in becoming the leading space exploration state in the nation; 21 22 act as a liaison with other state and federal (6) entities related economic, educational, 23 with and defense 24 responsibilities to support the marketing of the state's aerospace 25 and aviation capabilities; (7) [(6)] provide technical support and expertise to 26

the state and to local spaceport authorities regarding aerospace

- 1 and aviation business matters; and
- 2 (8)  $\left[\frac{(7)}{1}\right]$  be responsible for the promotion and
- 3 development of spaceports in this state.
- 4 (d-1) The aerospace and aviation office shall make specific
- 5 short-term and long-term statutory, administrative, and
- 6 budget-related recommendations to the legislature and the governor
- 7 regarding the policy initiatives and reforms described by
- 8 Subsection (d)(5) that may be implemented by the state. The
- 9 short-term recommendations must include a plan for state action for
- 10 implementation beginning not later than September 1, 2017. The
- 11 initiatives and reforms in the short-term plan must be fully
- 12 implemented by September 1, 2020. The long-term recommendations
- 13 must include a plan for state action for implementation beginning
- 14 not later than September 1, 2020. The initiatives and reforms in
- 15 the long-term plan must be fully implemented by September 1, 2025.
- 16 The aerospace and aviation office shall submit these
- 17 recommendations to the legislature and governor with the biennial
- 18 report required by Subsection (d-2) not later than December 1,
- 19 2016. This subsection expires September 1, 2017.
- 20 (d-2) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 21 the aerospace and aviation office shall submit to the legislature
- 22 and governor, in printed or electronic form, a report detailing the
- 23 <u>actions taken by the aerospace and aviation office in carrying out</u>
- 24 the policy initiatives and reforms under Subsection (d)(5) to
- 25 further the purposes of the industry-specific strategic plan as
- 26 specified in the recommendations required by Subsection (d-1),
- 27 including:

	(1) the status of all projects and activities,
2	(2) the funding of expenditures;
3	(3) a summary of work performed as part of the
4	aerospace and aviation office's partnership with the Texas Higher
5	Education Coordinating Board, including a summary prepared by the
6	board of the research conducted by public senior colleges or
7	universities, as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code;
8	(4) a summary of work performed as part of the
9	aerospace and aviation office's partnership with the Texas
10	Workforce Commission; and
11	(5) an explanation of the ways in which the aerospace
12	and aviation office has promoted the state's economic development
13	goals through increased space exploration activities.
14	(e) The governor shall appoint an aerospace and aviation
15	advisory committee consisting of $\underline{:}$
16	(1) seven qualified members to assist in the state's
17	economic development efforts to recruit and retain aerospace and
18	aviation jobs and investment; and
19	(2) one member for each active spaceport development
20	corporation in the state who represents the interests of each
21	respective spaceport development corporation.
22	(e-1) The <u>aerospace and aviation advisory</u> committee shall:
23	(1) advise the governor on the recruitment and
24	retention of aerospace and aviation jobs and investment $\underline{:}$
25	(2) assist the office and the aerospace and aviation
26	office in meeting the state's economic development efforts to

recruit and retain aerospace and aviation jobs and investment;

- 1 (3) advise the office, the aerospace and aviation
- 2 office, and the governor on an appropriate funding level for the
- 3 spaceport trust fund;
- 4 (4) advise the office, the aerospace and aviation
- 5 office, and the governor on recruitment, retention, and expansion
- 6 of aerospace and aviation industry activities; and
- 7 (5) collect and disseminate information on federal,
- 8 state, local, and private community economic development programs
- 9 that assist or provide loans, grants, or other funding to aerospace
- 10 and aviation industry activities.
- 11 <u>(e-2)</u> Members of the <u>aerospace and aviation advisory</u>
- 12 committee:
- 13 (1) shall serve staggered four-year terms; and
- 14 <u>(2)</u> may not receive compensation for serving on the
- 15 committee.
- 16 SECTION 2. (a) The terms of the current members of the
- 17 aerospace and aviation advisory committee expire on the effective
- 18 date of this Act. On that date or as soon as possible after that
- 19 date, the governor shall appoint new members to the aerospace and
- 20 aviation advisory committee in accordance with the requirements of
- 21 Section 481.0066(e), Government Code, as amended by this Act.
- (b) A member of the aerospace and aviation advisory
- 23 committee serving immediately before the effective date of this Act
- 24 is eligible for reappointment to the committee if the person has the
- 25 qualifications for a member under Section 481.0066(e), Government
- 26 Code, as amended by this Act.
- 27 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
