## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the affidavit required to be exempt from jury service
- 3 due to a physical or mental impairment.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 62.109(b) and (f), Government Code, are
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) A person requesting an exemption under this section must
- 8 submit to the court an affidavit stating the person's name and
- 9 address and the reason for and the duration of the requested
- 10 exemption. A person requesting an exemption due to a physical or
- 11 mental impairment must attach to the affidavit a statement from a
- 12 physician or an advanced practice registered nurse as defined by
- 13 <u>Section 301.152</u>, <u>Occupations Code</u>. The affidavit and physician's
- 14 or registered nurse's statement may be submitted to the court at the
- 15 time the person is summoned for jury service or at any other time.
- 16 (f) An affidavit accompanying a request for an exemption
- 17 from jury service because of a physical or mental impairment may be
- 18 presented by the affiant or by a friend or relative of the affiant.
- 19 The affidavit must state:
- 20 (1) the name and address of the physician <u>or advanced</u>
- 21 practice registered nurse whose statement accompanies the
- 22 affidavit;
- 23 (2) whether the request is for a permanent or
- 24 temporary exemption;

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- 1 (3) the period of time for which a temporary exemption
- 2 is requested; and
- 3 (4) that as a direct result of the physical or mental
- 4 impairment it is impossible or very difficult for the affiant to
- 5 serve on a jury.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
