- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 554.004, Occupations 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 554.004. ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION, IMMUNIZATION,
- 8 OR VACCINATION.

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- 9 SECTION 2. Section 554.004(a), Occupations Code, is amended 10 to read as follows:
- 11 (a) The board shall specify conditions under which a
- 12 pharmacist may administer medication, including an immunization $\underline{\text{or}}$
- 13 [and] vaccination. The conditions for the administration of an
- 14 immunization or vaccination must ensure that:
- 15 (1) [a licensed health care provider authorized to
- 16 administer the medication is not reasonably available to administer
- 17 the medication;
- 18 [(2) failure to administer the medication, other than
- 19 an immunization or vaccination, might result in a significant delay
- 20 or interruption of a critical phase of drug therapy;
- [(3)] the pharmacist possesses the necessary skill,
- 22 education, and certification as specified by the board to
- 23 administer the <u>immunization or vaccination</u> [medication];
- 24 $\underline{(2)}$ [$\overline{(4)}$] within a reasonable time after

- 1 administering an immunization or vaccination [medication], the
- 2 pharmacist notifies the licensed health care provider responsible
- 3 for the patient's care that the immunization or vaccination
- 4 [medication] was administered;
- 5 (3) $\left[\frac{(5)}{(5)}\right]$ the pharmacist may not administer an
- 6 <u>immunization or vaccination</u> [medication] to a patient at the
- 7 patient's residence, except at a licensed nursing home or hospital;
- 8 (4) $[\frac{(6)}{(6)}]$ the pharmacist administers an immunization
- 9 or vaccination under a physician's written protocol and meets the
- 10 standards established by the board; and
- 11 (5) (7) the authority of a pharmacist to administer
- 12 an immunization or vaccination [medication] may not be delegated.
- SECTION 3. Sections 554.052(a) and (c), Occupations Code,
- 14 are amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) The board by rule shall require a pharmacist to notify a
- 16 physician who prescribes an immunization or vaccination [within 24
- 17 hours] after the pharmacist administers the immunization or
- 18 vaccination. The physician shall prescribe the period for providing
- 19 notice and the form of the notice in the physician's written
- 20 protocol. The period for providing notice may not be later than the
- 21 14th day after the date the immunization or vaccination is
- 22 <u>administered.</u>
- 23 (c) Supervision by a physician is adequate if the delegating
- 24 physician:
- 25 (1) is responsible for formulating or approving an
- 26 order or protocol, including the physician's order, standing
- 27 medical order, or standing delegation order, and periodically

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- 1 reviews the order or protocol and the services provided to a patient
- 2 under the order or protocol;
- 3 (2) $\left[\frac{\text{except as provided by Subsection } (c-1)_{T}\right]$ has
- 4 established a physician-patient relationship with each patient
- 5 under $\underline{\text{seven}}$ [$\frac{14}{1}$] years of age and referred the patient to the
- 6 pharmacist;
- 7 (3) is geographically located to be easily accessible
- 8 to the pharmacy where an immunization or vaccination is
- 9 administered;
- 10 (4) receives, as appropriate, a periodic status report
- 11 on the patient, including any problem or complication encountered;
- 12 and
- 13 (5) is available through direct telecommunication for
- 14 consultation, assistance, and direction.
- SECTION 4. Section 554.052(c-1), Occupations Code, is
- 16 repealed.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
