- 1 (e) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 2 <u>adopt rules to administer this section.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 4 shall adopt the rules required by Section 51.979, Education Code,
- 5 as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after this Act takes
- 6 effect. For that purpose, the coordinating board may adopt the
- 7 initial rules in the manner provided by law for emergency rules.
- 8 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies
- 9 beginning with the 2015 fall semester.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
