## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to inclusion of mental health concerns in existing school
3	health efforts.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 28.004, Education Code, is amended by
6	amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (1-2) to read as
7	follows:
8	(d) The board of trustees shall appoint at least five
9	members to the local school health advisory council. A majority of
10	the members must be persons who are parents of students enrolled in
11	the district and who are not employed by the district. One of those
12	members shall serve as chair or co-chair of the council. The board
13	of trustees also may appoint one or more persons from each of the
14	following groups or a representative from a group other than a group
15	specified under this subsection:
16	(1) public school teachers;
17	(2) public school administrators;
18	(3) district students;
19	(4) health care professionals;
20	(5) the business community;
21	(6) law enforcement;
22	(7) senior citizens;
23	(8) the clergy;

(9) nonprofit health organizations; [and]

1	(10) local domestic violence programs <u>;</u>
2	(11) local community mental health providers; and
3	(12) local substance abuse services providers.
4	(1-2) The local school health advisory council shall:
5	(1) review the adopted health education curriculum for
6	accuracy and content related to mental health and consider the
7	inclusion of the following topics:
8	(A) recognition of signs and symptoms related to
9	mental illness;
10	(B) mental health stigmas;
11	(C) substance abuse; and
12	(D) stress management;
13	(2) make recommendations regarding professional
14	development designed to promote the ability of school district
15	staff to build positive relationships with students, increase
16	school connectedness, and improve recognition and understanding of
17	mental health issues; and
18	(3) make policy recommendations to the school district
19	concerning the integration of social and emotional learning into
20	the academic curriculum.
21	SECTION 2. Section 38.013(a), Education Code, is amended to
22	read as follows:
23	(a) The agency shall make available to each school district
24	one or more coordinated health programs designed to prevent
25	obesity, cardiovascular disease, oral diseases, [and] Type 2
26	diabetes, and mental health concerns in elementary school, middle
27	school, and junior high school students. Each program must provide

1 for coordinating: (1) health education, including 2 oral health education; 3 4 (2) physical education and physical activity; (3) nutrition services; [and] 5 6 (4) parental involvement; and 7 (5) physical and mental health policies, services, and 8 supports. SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

13 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
