## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the period for which the Texas Commission on
- 3 Environmental Quality may grant or renew an emergency authorization
- 4 relating to the use of state water.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 11.139, Water Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (a) Except as provided by Section 11.148 [of this code], the
- 10 commission may grant an emergency permit, order, or amendment to an
- 11 existing permit, certified filing, or certificate of adjudication
- 12 after notice to the governor for an initial period of not more than
- 13 270 [120] days if the commission finds that:
- 14 <u>(1)</u> emergency conditions exist which present an
- 15 imminent threat to the public health and safety and which override
- 16 the necessity to comply with established statutory procedures; and
- 17 (2) there are no feasible practicable alternatives to
- 18 the emergency authorization.
- 19 (a-1) Such emergency action may be renewed once for not
- 20 longer than 60 days.
- 21 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 22 to an application for an emergency authorization or renewal of an
- 23 emergency authorization that is submitted to the Texas Commission
- 24 on Environmental Quality on or after the effective date of this Act.

- 1 An application for an emergency authorization or renewal of an
- 2 emergency authorization that is submitted to the commission before
- 3 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect
- 4 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is
- 5 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
