## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

L	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the period for which the Texas Commission on
- 3 Environmental Quality may grant or renew an emergency authorization
- 4 relating to the use of state water.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 11.139, Water Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (a) Except as provided by Section 11.148 [of this code], the
- 10 commission may grant an emergency permit, order, or amendment to an
- 11 existing permit, certified filing, or certificate of adjudication
- 12 after notice to the governor for an initial period of not more than
- 13 <u>two years</u> [<del>120 days</del>] if the commission finds that:
- 14 (1) emergency conditions exist which present an
- 15 imminent threat to the public health and safety and which override
- 16 the necessity to comply with established statutory procedures; and
- 17  $\underline{(2)}$  there are no feasible practicable alternatives to
- 18 the emergency authorization.
- 19 (a-1) The commission may renew an [Such] emergency
- 20 <u>authorization granted under Subsection (a)</u> [action may be renewed
- 21 once] for successive periods of not longer than one year each [60
- 22 days]. The commission may provide for automatic renewals of an
- 23 authorization for periods of not longer than one year each.
- SECTION 2. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this

- 1 section, the change in law made by this Act applies only to an
- 2 application for an emergency authorization or renewal of an
- 3 emergency authorization that is submitted to the Texas Commission
- 4 on Environmental Quality on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 5 An application for an emergency authorization or renewal of an
- 6 emergency authorization that is submitted to the commission before
- 7 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect
- 8 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is
- 9 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 10 (b) If on or after the effective date of this Act a person
- 11 submits to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality an
- 12 application for the renewal of an emergency authorization that was
- 13 granted by the commission before the effective date of this Act, the
- 14 commission may renew the emergency authorization once for a period
- 15 of not longer than one year.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
