- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 411.063(a), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The <u>department</u> [State Preservation Board] shall adopt
- 8 rules for the safe movement and the parking of vehicles in the
- 9 Capitol Complex. [The department shall administer and enforce the
- 10 rules adopted by the preservation board and shall administer and
- 11 enforce this subchapter. This subsection does not affect the
- 12 authority of the department to adopt rules under Section 411.067.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 411.065(a), Government Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (a) A person commits an offense if the person violates a
- 16 rule of the department adopted under Section 411.062 or [a rule of
- 17 the State Preservation Board adopted under | Section 411.063.
- SECTION 3. On the effective date of this Act, rules of the
- 19 State Preservation Board adopted under Section 411.063, Government
- 20 Code, are transferred to the Department of Public Safety of the
- 21 State of Texas and are continued in effect until amended or repealed
- 22 by the Department of Public Safety.
- SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 24 411.065, Government Code, applies only to an offense committed on

- 1 or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed
- 2 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 3 effect on the date the offense was committed, and the former law is
- 4 continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section,
- 5 an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if
- 6 any element of the offense occurred before that date.
- 7 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
