BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 82.037(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

- Each person admitted to practice law shall, before (a) receiving a license, take an oath that the person will:
- (1)support the constitutions of the United States and this state;
- (2)honestly demean oneself [himself] in the practice of law; [and]
- (3) discharge the attorney's duty to the attorney's [his] client to the best of the attorney's ability; and (4) conduct oneself with integrity and civility in dealing and communicating with the court and all parties.

 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
