A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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2 relating to certain event trust funds and the abolishment of the 3 special event trust fund.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Sections 4(i) and (1), Chapter 1507 (S.B. 456), 6 Acts of the 76th Legislature, Regular Session, 1999 (Article 7 5190.14, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), as amended by Chapters 579 8 (H.B. 1675) and 814 (S.B. 275), Acts of the 78th Legislature, 9 Regular Session, 2003, are reenacted and amended to read as 10 follows:

The comptroller shall provide an estimate not later than 11 (i) 12 September [December] 1 [$\frac{1}{7}$ 2003 $_{7}$] of the year that is eight years before the year in which the games would be held in this state of the 13 14 total amount of state and municipal tax revenue that would be deposited in the Pan American Games trust fund before January 1 [τ 15 2012,] of the year following the year in which the games would be 16 held, if the games were to be held in this state at a site selected 17 pursuant to an application by a local organizing committee. The 18 comptroller shall provide the estimate on request to a local 19 organizing committee. A local organizing committee may submit the 20 21 comptroller's estimate to a site selection organization.

(1) On January 1 [-, 2013,-] of the second year following the year in which the games are held in this state, the comptroller shall transfer to the general revenue fund any money remaining in

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1 the Pan American Games trust fund, not to exceed the amount of state 2 revenue remaining in the trust fund, plus any interest earned on 3 that state revenue. The comptroller shall remit to the endorsing 4 municipality any money remaining in the trust fund after the 5 required amount is transferred to the general revenue fund.

6 SECTION 2. Section 5A(a), Chapter 1507 (S.B. 456), Acts of 7 the 76th Legislature, Regular Session, 1999 (Article 5190.14, 8 Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is amended by amending Subdivision 9 (4) and by amending Subdivision (5), as amended by S.B. 293, Acts of 10 the 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 2015, to read as follows:

"Event" means a Super Bowl, a National Collegiate 11 (4) Athletic Association Final Four tournament game, the National 12 Basketball Association All-Star Game, the X Games, the National 13 14 Hockey League All-Star Game, the Major League Baseball All-Star 15 Game, a game of the National Collegiate Athletic Association Bowl Championship Series or its successor or a National Collegiate 16 17 Athletic Association Division I Football Bowl Subdivision postseason playoff or championship game, the National Collegiate 18 19 Athletic Association men's or women's lacrosse championships, a World Cup Soccer game, the World Cup soccer tournament, the Major 20 League Soccer All-Star Game, the Major League Soccer Cup, the 21 Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association National Finals Rodeo, an 22 Elite Rodeo Association World Championship, the United States Open 23 24 Championship, the World Games, a national collegiate championship of an amateur sport sanctioned by the national governing body of the 25 26 sport that is recognized by the United States Olympic Committee, an Olympic activity, including a Junior or Senior activity, training 27

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1 program, or feeder program sanctioned by the United States Olympic Committee's Community Olympic Development Program, the Amateur 2 3 Athletic Union Junior Olympic Games, a mixed martial arts championship, the Breeders' Cup World Championships, a Formula One 4 5 automobile race, the Moto Grand Prix of the United States, the Academy of Country Music Awards, the National Cutting Horse 6 Association Triple Crown, a national political convention of the 7 8 Republican National Committee or the Democratic National Committee, a presidential general election debate, or the largest 9 10 event held each year at a sports entertainment venue in this state with a permanent seating capacity, including grandstand and premium 11 seating, of not less than 125,000. 12 The term includes any activities related to or associated with an event. 13

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(5) "Site selection organization" means:

15 (A) the National Football League, the National Collegiate Athletic Association, the National 16 Basketball 17 Association, ESPN or an affiliate, the National Hockey League, Major League Baseball, the Federation Internationale de Football 18 19 Association (FIFA), the International World Games Association, the National Association for Stock Car Auto Racing (NASCAR), Dorna 20 Sports, the Amateur Athletic Union, the Professional Rodeo Cowboys 21 Association, the Elite Rodeo Association, Major League Soccer, the 22 United States Golf Association, or the United States Olympic 23 24 Committee;

(B) the national governing body of a sport that
is recognized by the United States Olympic Committee, the National
Thoroughbred Racing Association, Formula One Management Limited,

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or the Federation Internationale de l'Automobile; 1 2 (C) the Academy of Country Music; 3 (D) the National Cutting Horse Association; 4 (E) the Republican National Committee or the 5 Democratic National Committee; [or] 6 (F) the Ultimate Fighting Championship; or (G) the Commission on Presidential Debates. 7 Section 5A, Chapter 1507 (S.B. 456), Acts of the 8 SECTION 3. 76th Legislature, Regular Session, 1999 (Article 5190.14, Vernon's 9 10 Texas Civil Statutes), is amended by adding Subsection (a-3) to read as follows: 11 (a-3) For purposes of Subsection (a-1) of this section, each 12 presidential general election debate in a series of presidential 13 14 debates before a general election is considered a separate, single 15 event. 16 SECTION 4. Chapter 398, Local Government Code, is repealed. 17 SECTION 5. Notwithstanding the repeal by this Act of Chapter 398, Local Government Code, a special event plan approved 18 under former Chapter 398 of that code before September 1, 2015, is 19 governed by the law as it existed immediately before the effective 20 date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that 21 22 purpose. 23 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
