- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 115.005, Human Resources Code,
- amended to read as follows:

- Sec. 115.005. SUNSET PROVISION. The Governor's Committee 7
- on People with Disabilities is subject to Chapter 325, Government 8
- Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided 9
- by that chapter, the committee is abolished and this chapter 10
- expires September 1, 2027 $\left[\frac{2015}{2015}\right]$. 11
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 115.009, Human Resources Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 115.009. FUNCTIONS. The committee shall: 14
- (1) serve as a central source of information and 15
- education on the abilities, rights, problems, and needs of persons 16
- with disabilities and, as necessary, issue reports; 17
- 18 (2) provide information to and advise the governor and
- the governor's staff on matters relating to the full participation 19
- 20 of persons with disabilities in all aspects of life;
- 21 (3) before the end of each even-numbered year, submit
- 22 to the governor and to the legislature a report that includes[+

- 7 (4) serve as the state's liaison agency in working with
- 8 the President's Committee on Employment of Persons with
- 9 Disabilities and other entities involved in activities or concerns
- 10 affecting persons with disabilities;
- 11 (5) develop and work with a statewide network of
- 12 volunteer community-level committees to promote dissemination of
- 13 information about and implementation of federal and state laws
- 14 addressing rights and opportunities for persons with disabilities;
- 15 (6) [evaluate the state's compliance with the federal
- 16 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Pub. L. No. 101-336) and
- 17 other federal and state statutes relating to rights and
- 18 opportunities for persons with disabilities;
- 19 $\left[\frac{(7)}{}\right]$ provide information and technical assistance to
- 20 public and private agencies and businesses to promote and
- 21 facilitate implementation of the [federal] Americans with
- 22 Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. Section 12101 et seq.)[(Pub. L.
- 23 No. 101-336) and other federal and state statutes relating to
- 24 rights and opportunities of persons with disabilities;
- 25 <u>(7)</u> [(8) collect and evaluate data on employment of
- 26 persons with disabilities by state agencies;

- 3 (8) $[\frac{(10)}{}]$ promote the compilation and publication of
- 4 state laws relating to persons with disabilities; [and]
- $\underline{(9)}$ [$\underline{(11)}$] issue awards and other forms of recognition
- 6 to persons and organizations making outstanding contributions to
- 7 the employment of persons with disabilities and to public awareness
- 8 of issues impacting persons with disabilities;
- 9 (10) identify each current long-range plan relating to
- 10 persons with disabilities created by a state agency or a committee
- 11 of a state agency and publish the link to the Internet website
- 12 <u>address for each long-range plan, if a</u>vailable, on the Internet
- 13 website of the Governor's Committee on People with Disabilities;

- 15 (11) review and analyze the long-range plans described
- 16 by Subdivision (10) to identify gaps in state laws and services for
- 17 persons with disabilities and make biennial recommendations in the
- 18 committee's report required under Subdivision (3) to address
- 19 <u>identified gaps</u>.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
