- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to a study of the feasibility and desirability of creating
- 3 and maintaining a coastal barrier system.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. (a) The legislature shall establish a joint
- 6 interim committee to continue to study the feasibility and
- 7 desirability of creating and maintaining a coastal barrier system
- 8 in this state that includes a series of gates and barriers to
- 9 prevent storm surge damage to gulf beaches or coastal ports,
- 10 industry, or property.
- 11 (b) The committee is composed of:
- 12 (1) the members of the standing committee of the
- 13 senate that has primary jurisdiction over natural resources;
- 14 (2) the members of the standing committee of the house
- 15 of representatives that has primary jurisdiction over land and
- 16 resource management;
- 17 (3) two members of the senate appointed by the
- 18 lieutenant governor, each of whom represents a district in a county
- 19 that borders the Gulf of Mexico; and
- 20 (4) two members of the house of representatives
- 21 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, each of
- 22 whom represents a district in a county that borders the Gulf of
- 23 Mexico.
- (c) The lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of

- 1 representatives shall jointly designate a chair or, alternatively,
- 2 designate two co-chairs from among the committee membership.
- 3 (d) The committee may adopt rules necessary to carry out the
- 4 committee's duties under this section.
- 5 (e) Not later than December 1, 2016, the committee shall
- 6 report to the governor and the legislature the findings of the study
- 7 and any recommendations developed by the committee under this
- 8 section.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
