- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 502.196, Transportation Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 502.196. DEPOSIT OF REGISTRATION FEES IN STATE HIGHWAY
- 8 FUND. Except as otherwise provided by this chapter or Section
- 9 662.011, the board and the department shall deposit all money
- 10 received from registration fees in the state treasury to the credit
- 11 of the state highway fund.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 502.251, Transportation Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 502.251. FEE: MOTORCYCLE OR MOPED. The fee for a
- 15 registration year for registration of a motorcycle or moped is \$33
- 16 [\$30].
- 17 SECTION 3. Section 662.011, Transportation Code, is amended
- 18 by adding Subsections (a-1) and (b-1) and amending Subsection (b)
- 19 to read as follows:
- 20 (a-1) Of each fee collected under Section 502.251, the Texas
- 21 Department of Motor Vehicles shall send \$3 to the comptroller for
- 22 deposit to the credit of a subaccount in the motorcycle education
- 23 fund account.
- 24 (b) Money deposited to the credit of the motorcycle

- 1 education fund account may be used only to defray the cost of:
- 2 <u>(1)</u> administering the motorcycle operator training
- 3 and safety program; and
- 4 (2) conducting the motorcyclist safety and share the
- 5 road campaign described by Section 201.621.
- 6 (b-1) The designated state agency shall, at a minimum, use
- 7 funds appropriated to the agency from the subaccount to administer
- 8 the motorcycle operator training and safety program.
- 9 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 10 the fee for a registration period beginning on or after the
- 11 effective date of this Act. A fee for a registration period
- 12 beginning before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
- 13 law in effect when the registration period began, and the former law
- 14 is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
