9	by the institution per 100 undergraduate full-time student
10	equivalents;
11	(4) the total number of undergraduate degrees awarded
12	by the institution to at-risk students;
13	(5) the total number of undergraduate students at the
14	institution having successfully completed at least 25 percent of
15	the student's degree requirements or having earned at least 30
16	credit hours toward a 120-credit-hour degree;
17	(6) the total number of undergraduate students at the
18	institution having successfully completed at least 50 percent of
19	the student's degree requirements or having earned at least 60
20	credit hours toward a 120-credit-hour degree;
21	(7) the total number of undergraduate students having
22	successfully completed at least 75 percent of the student's degree
23	requirements or having earned at least 90 credit hours toward a
24	120-credit-hour degree;
25	(8) the average length of enrollment, by number of
26	semesters, required for undergraduate degree completion;
27	(9) the four-year graduation rate of first-time,

full-time, bachelor's degree-seeking students who enrolled in at 1 2 least 12 semester credit hours in the student's first fall semester 3 at the institution and who graduated from the institution or from 4 any other institution of higher education or private or independent 5 institution of higher education; 6 (10) the six-year graduation rate of first-time, 7 full-time, bachelor's degree-seeking students who enrolled in at least 12 semester credit hours in the student's first fall semester 8 9 at the institution and who graduated from the institution or from any other institution of higher education or private or independent 10 11 institution of higher education; and 12 (11) the institution's administrative costs. 13 (c) This section applies only to a general academic teaching institution other than a public state college. 14 15 (d) The coordinating board in consultation with the Legislative Budget Board shall determine whether an institution has 16 achieved the applicable target levels for purposes of Subsections 17 (f) and (g). Using the negotiated rulemaking procedures under 18 Chapter 2008, Government Code, the coordinating board by rule shall 19 20 establish the process by which an institution's achievement on a 21 performance measure is submitted to and verified by the 22 coordinating board. 23 (e) The coordinating board shall notify the governing board of an institution as soon as practicable after the coordinating 24 board determines that Subsection (f) or (g) applies to the tuition 25 charged by the institution for an academic year and of the 26 27 limitation prescribed by the applicable subsection on the amount of

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1 tuition that may be charged by the institution for that academic
2 year.

(f) This subsection applies to tuition charged for an 3 4 academic year by an institution to which this section applies only if the institution did not achieve, in the most recent state fiscal 5 year preceding that academic year for which information is 6 7 available, a majority of the target levels assigned to the performance measures included in the General Appropriations Act as 8 applicable to the institution for that state fiscal year. For an 9 academic year in which this subsection applies to the tuition 10 charged by an institution, unless the institution has been granted 11 an exception under Subsection (j) for that year, the amount of 12 13 tuition the governing board of the institution charges under Section 54.0513 to a student for that academic year may not exceed 14 the total amount of tuition that the governing board would have 15 16 charged under that section to a similarly situated student in the preceding academic year, as that amount is adjusted for each 17 academic year for inflation as determined under Subsection (i). 18 The governing board may not increase the amount of tuition charged 19 20 under this subsection to a student more than once in any academic 21 year.

(g) This subsection applies to tuition charged for an academic year by an institution to which this section applies only if the institution achieved, in the most recent state fiscal year preceding that academic year for which information is available, a majority of the target levels assigned to the performance measures included in the General Appropriations Act as applicable to the

institution for that state fiscal year. For an academic year in 1 which this subsection applies to the tuition charged by an 2 3 institution, the amount of tuition the governing board of the institution charges under Section 54.0513 to a student for that 4 academic year may not exceed by more than three percent the total 5 amount of tuition that the governing board would have charged under 6 7 that section to a similarly situated student in the preceding academic year, as that amount is adjusted for each academic year for 8 inflation as determined under Subsection (i). The governing board 9 may not increase the amount of tuition charged under this 10 11 subsection to a student more than once in any academic year.

12 (h) For purposes of this section:

13 (1) an institution is considered to have achieved a 14 target level assigned to a performance measure if the institution 15 has achieved at least 98 percent of the target level; and

16 (2) students are similarly situated if they share the 17 same residency status, degree program, course load, course level, 18 tuition exemption status, and other circumstances affecting the 19 tuition charged to the student.

20 (i) Not later than January 31 of each year, or as soon thereafter as practicable, the Legislative Budget Board shall 21 publish and certify to the governing board of each institution to 22 which this section applies the inflation rate to be used for 23 purposes of this section for the next academic year. The inflation 24 25 rate is the percentage increase, if any, as expressed in decimal form rounded to the nearest thousandth of one percent, in the 26 27 consumer price index, as defined by Section 341.201, Finance Code,

1	for the preceding calendar year as compared to the consumer price
2	index for the year preceding that year.
3	(j) The coordinating board, using the negotiated rulemaking
4	procedures under Chapter 2008, Government Code, by rule shall
5	establish an exception to the application of Subsection (f) for an
6	institution to which that subsection would otherwise apply for an
7	academic year in the event of a natural disaster or other
8	extraordinary circumstance affecting the institution's achievement
9	on performance measures. Subsection (g) applies to an institution
10	that is granted an exception under this subsection.
11	Sec. 54.05132. TEMPORARY LIMITATION ON TOTAL AMOUNT OF
12	TUITION. (a) In this section:
13	(1) "General academic teaching institution" and
14	"public state college" have the meanings assigned by Section
15	<u>61.003.</u>
16	(2) "Tuition" includes:
17	(A) tuition for which the rates are prescribed by
18	this chapter; and
19	(B) tuition charged by an institution of higher
20	education under Section 54.0513 or another law authorizing an
21	institution to establish tuition rates.
22	(b) Notwithstanding Section 54.0513, the total amount of
23	tuition charged by a general academic teaching institution other
24	than a public state college to a student for the 2016-2017 or
25	2017-2018 academic year may not exceed by more than one percent the
26	total amount of tuition that the institution would have charged
27	under this chapter to a similarly situated student for the

preceding academic year, as that amount is adjusted for each 1 academic year for inflation as determined under Subsection (c). 2 3 For purposes of this subsection, students are similarly situated if they share the same residency status, degree program, course load, 4 course level, tuition exemption status, and other circumstances 5 affecting the tuition charged to the student. This subsection does 6 7 not ensure that the total amount of tuition charged to an individual student does not increase based on a change in the student's 8 residency status, degree program, course load, course level, 9 tuition exemption status, or other circumstance affecting the 10 11 tuition charged to the student.

(c) Not later than January 31 of each year, or as soon 12 13 thereafter as practicable, the Legislative Budget Board shall publish and certify to the governing board of each institution to 14 which this section applies the inflation rate to be used for 15 16 purposes of this section for the next academic year. The inflation rate is the percentage increase, if any, as expressed in decimal 17 18 form rounded to the nearest thousandth of one percent, in the consumer price index, as defined by Section 341.201, Finance Code, 19 20 for the preceding calendar year as compared to the consumer price index for the year preceding that year. 21

(d) This section expires September 1, 2018.

23 SECTION 2. Chapter 322, Government Code, is amended by 24 adding Section 322.025 to read as follows:

25 <u>Sec. 322.025. RECOMMENDATIONS FOR PERFORMANCE MEASURE</u>
26 <u>TARGET LEVELS FOR CERTAIN INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION.</u>
27 (a) In this section:

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1	(1) "Institution of higher education" and "university
2	system" have the meanings assigned by Section 61.003, Education
3	<u>Code.</u>
4	(2) "Performance measure" means a performance measure
5	adopted under Section 54.05131(b), Education Code.
6	(b) The governing board of each institution of higher
7	education to which Section 54.05131, Education Code, applies shall
8	submit to the board, as part of the institution's legislative
9	appropriations request for the general appropriations bill
10	prepared by the board under Section 322.008, a target level for each
11	performance measure applicable to the institution for each of the
12	state fiscal years covered by the bill. The target levels submitted
13	by an institution under this subsection must be established by the
14	institution's governing board in consultation with the
15	institution's president and provosts and with the institution's
16	system administration, if the institution is a component
17	institution of a university system. In establishing the target
18	levels, the institution's governing board shall adhere to the Texas
19	Higher Education Coordinating Board's standards under Subsection
20	<u>(c).</u>
21	(c) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, using
22	the negotiated rulemaking procedures under Chapter 2008, by rule
23	shall develop standards to be considered by the governing board of
24	an institution of higher education in establishing the
25	institution's target levels for performance measures under
26	Subsection (b). In developing the standards, the negotiating
27	committee established for purposes of this subsection and the

coordinating board shall consider institutional improvement on 1 The coordinating board shall reconvene the 2 target levels. negotiating committee to assist the coordinating board whenever the 3 coordinating board modifies or updates the standards. 4 5 (d) The board, in preparing the general appropriations bill under Section 322.008, shall include the performance measure target 6 7 levels submitted by each institution under Subsection (b) of this section to which money is to be appropriated in the bill, as 8 recommendations for the target levels to be included in the 9 appropriations to the institution for each of the state fiscal 10 11 years covered by the bill.
