A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the period of eligibility for support from the universal service plan for certain providers. 1-21 1-22 1-23

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 56.023(p), Utilities Code, is amended to 1-24 1-25 read as follows:

(p) If an incumbent local exchange company or cooperative is ineligible for support under a plan established under Section 56.021(1) for services in an exchange, a plan established under Section 56.021(1) may not provide support to any other 1-26 1-27 1-28 1-29 telecommunications providers for services in that exchange, except 1-30 that an eligible telecommunications provider that is receiving support under Section 56.021(1)(A) in that exchange shall continue 1-31 1-32 1-33 to receive such support until the later of December 31, 2017, or the second anniversary of [for a 24-month period following] the date 1-34 the incumbent local exchange provider or cooperative ceases 1-35 receiving support in that exchange.
