1-15 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
1-16 AN ACT

1-17 relating to the College Credit for Heroes program.  
1-18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:  
1-19 SECTION 1. Section 302.0031, Labor Code, is amended by  
1-20 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (g) to read as  
1-21 follows:  
1-22 (b) The commission shall establish and administer the  
1-23 College Credit for Heroes [~~demonstration~~] program to identify,  
1-24 develop, and support methods to maximize academic or workforce  
1-25 education credit awarded by institutions of higher education to  
1-26 veterans and military servicemembers for military experience,  
1-27 education, and training obtained during military service in order  
1-28 to expedite the entry of veterans and military servicemembers into  
1-29 the workforce.  
1-30 (g) Not later than November 1 of each year, the commission,  
1-31 after consultation with the Texas Higher Education Coordinating  
1-32 Board, shall report to the legislature and the governor on:  
1-33 (1) the results of any grants awarded under this  
1-34 section;  
1-35 (2) the best practices for veterans and military  
1-36 servicemembers to achieve maximum academic or workforce education  
1-37 credit at institutions of higher education for military experience,  
1-38 education, and training obtained during military service;  
1-39 (3) measures needed to facilitate the award of  
1-40 academic or workforce education credit by institutions of higher  
1-41 education for military experience, education, and training  
1-42 obtained during military service; and  
1-43 (4) other related measures needed to facilitate the  
1-44 entry of trained, qualified veterans and military servicemembers  
1-45 into the workforce.  
1-46 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
1-47 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
1-48 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
1-49 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
1-50 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
