S.B. No. 888

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the appeal of waiver of jurisdiction and transfer to criminal court in juvenile cases.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Article 4.18(g), Code of Criminal Procedure, is amended to read as follows:

(g) This article does not apply to a claim of a defect or error in a discretionary transfer proceeding in juvenile court. A defendant may appeal a defect or error only as provided by Chapter 56, Family Code [~~Article 44.47~~].

SECTION 2. Section 51.041(a), Family Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) The court retains jurisdiction over a person, without regard to the age of the person, for conduct engaged in by the person before becoming 17 years of age if, as a result of an appeal by the person or the state under Chapter 56 [~~or by the person under Article 44.47, Code of Criminal Procedure,~~] of an order of the court, the order is reversed or modified and the case remanded to the court by the appellate court.

SECTION 3. Sections 56.01(c) and (h), Family Code, are amended to read as follows:

(c) An appeal may be taken:

(1) except as provided by Subsection (n), by or on behalf of a child from an order entered under:

1 (A) Section 54.02 respecting transfer of the
2 child for prosecution as an adult;

3 (B) Section 54.03 with regard to delinquent
4 conduct or conduct indicating a need for supervision;

5 (C) [~~(B)~~] Section 54.04 disposing of the case;

6 (D) [~~(C)~~] Section 54.05 respecting modification
7 of a previous juvenile court disposition; or

8 (E) [~~(D)~~] Chapter 55 by a juvenile court
9 committing a child to a facility for the mentally ill or
10 intellectually disabled [~~mentally retarded~~]; or

11 (2) by a person from an order entered under Section
12 54.11(i)(2) transferring the person to the custody of the Texas
13 Department of Criminal Justice.

14 (h) If the order appealed from takes custody of the child
15 from the child's [~~his~~] parent, guardian, or custodian or waives
16 jurisdiction under Section 54.02 and transfers the child to
17 criminal court for prosecution, the appeal has precedence over all
18 other cases.

19 SECTION 4. Article 44.47, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
20 repealed.

21 SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act applies only
22 to an order of a juvenile court waiving jurisdiction and
23 transferring a child to criminal court that is issued on or after
24 the effective date of this Act. An order of a juvenile court waiving
25 jurisdiction and transferring a child to criminal court that is
26 issued before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law
27 in effect on the date the order was issued, and the former law is

1 continued in effect for that purpose.

2 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
