1-20 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1-21 AN ACT

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1-22 relating to providing training academies for public school teachers 1-23 who provide reading instruction to students in kindergarten through 1-24 1-25

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter J, Chapter 21, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 21.4552 to read as follows:

Sec. 21.4552. TEACHER LITERACY ACHIEVEMENT The commissioner shall develop and make available literacy achievement academies for teachers who provide:

reading instruction (1)to students the kindergarten or first, second, or third grade level; and

(2) reading comprehension instruction to students at the fourth or fifth grade level.

A literacy achievement academy developed under this (b) section:

must include training in: (1)

(A) effective and systematic instructional reading, including phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension; and

(B) the empirically validated use of instructional methods that are appropriate for struggling readers; and

(2) may include training in effective instructional practices in writing.

(c) The commissioner shall adopt criteria for selecteachers who may attend a literacy achievement academy. selecting In adopting selection criteria under this subsection, the commissioner shall require granting a priority to teachers employed by a school district at a campus at which 50 percent or more of the

students enrolled are educationally disadvantaged.
(d) From funds appropriated for that purpose, a teacher who attends a literacy achievement academy is entitled to receive a stipend in the amount determined by the commissioner. A stipend received under this subsection is not considered in determining whether a school district is paying the teacher the minimum monthly salary under Section 21.402.

1-58 (e) On request of the commissioner, regional education service centers shall assist the commissioner and agency with 1-59 training and other activities relating to the development and 1-60

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operation of literacy achievement academies.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
