A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

| 4 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 5 | SECTION 1. Section 261.203(b). Family Code. is amended to |

- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (b) If, after a child abuse or neglect investigation 8 described by Subsection (a) is completed, the department determines 9 a child's death, or a child's critical injury that reasonably could
- 10 have resulted in the child's death, was caused by abuse or neglect,
- 11 the department on request shall promptly release all investigation
- 12 information not prohibited from release under federal law,
- 13 including the following information [on request]:
- 14 (1) the information described by Subsection (a), if 15 not previously released to the person requesting the information;
- 16 (2) <u>information on whether a child's death was</u>
 17 <u>determined by the department to be attributable to abuse or neglect</u>
 18 <u>or resulted in a criminal investigation or the filing of criminal</u>
 19 charges;
- 20 (3) for cases in which the child's death occurred while

the child was living with the child's parent, managing conservator,

- 22 guardian, or other person entitled to possession of the child:
- 23 (A) a summary of any previous reports of abuse or 24 neglect of the deceased child or another child made while the child

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- 1 was living with that parent, managing conservator, guardian, or
- 2 other person entitled to possession of the child;
- 3 (B) the disposition of any report under Paragraph
- 4 (A);
- 5 (C) a description of any [the] services,
- 6 <u>including family-based safety services</u> [if any], that were provided
- 7 or offered by the department to the child or the child's family as a
- 8 result of any report under Paragraph (A) and whether the services
- 9 were accepted or declined; and
- 10 (D) the results of any risk or safety assessment
- 11 completed by the department relating to the deceased child; and
- (4) $\left[\frac{3}{3}\right]$ for a case in which the child's death
- 13 occurred while the child was in substitute care with the department
- 14 or with a residential child-care provider regulated under Chapter
- 15 42, Human Resources Code, the following information:
- 16 (A) the date the substitute care provider with
- 17 whom the child was residing at the time of death was licensed or
- 18 verified;
- 19 (B) a summary of any previous reports of abuse or
- 20 neglect investigated by the department relating to the substitute
- 21 care provider, including the disposition of any investigation
- 22 resulting from a report;
- 23 (C) any reported licensing violations, including
- 24 notice of any action taken by the department regarding a violation;
- 25 and
- 26 (D) records of any training completed by the
- 27 substitute care provider while the child was placed with the

- 1 provider.
- 2 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 261, Family Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Section 261.204 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 261.204. ANNUAL CHILD FATALITY REPORT. (a) The
- 5 department shall compile and publish an annual report on child
- 6 fatality investigations for which the department made a finding
- 7 regarding abuse or neglect, including cases in which the department
- 8 determined the fatality was not the result of abuse or neglect. The
- 9 report must protect the identity of individuals involved and
- 10 contain for each case the following information:
- 11 (1) the age and sex of the child and the county in
- 12 which the fatality occurred;
- 13 (2) whether the state was the managing conservator of
- 14 the child or whether the child resided with the child's parent,
- 15 managing conservator, guardian, or other person entitled to the
- 16 possession of the child at the time of the fatality;
- 17 (3) the relationship to the child of the individual
- 18 alleged to have abused or neglected the child, if any;
- 19 (4) the number of any department abuse or neglect
- 20 investigations involving the child or the individual alleged to
- 21 have abused or neglected the child during the two years preceding
- 22 the date of the fatality and the results of the investigations;
- 23 (5) whether the department offered family-based
- 24 safety services or conservatorship services to the child or family;
- 25 (6) the types of abuse and neglect alleged in the
- 26 reported investigations, if any; and
- 27 (7) any trends identified in the investigations

- 1 contained in the report.
- 2 (b) The department may release additional information in
- 3 the annual report if the release of the information is not
- 4 prohibited by state or federal law.
- 5 (c) The department shall post the annual report on the
- 6 department's Internet website and otherwise make the report
- 7 <u>available to the public.</u>
- 8 (d) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 9 Services Commission may adopt rules to implement this section.
- SECTION 3. Section 261.203(b), Family Code, as amended by
- 11 this Act, applies only to a request for information related to a
- 12 child fatality or near fatality submitted to the Department of
- 13 Family and Protective Services on or after the effective date of
- 14 this Act.
- SECTION 4. Not later than March 1, 2016, the Department of
- 16 Family and Protective Services shall publish on its Internet
- 17 website the initial report required by Section 261.204, Family
- 18 Code, as added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
